7 (b) Budgeted Enrollments: Each institution shall enroll to its budgeted biennial average full time equivalent enrollments, plus four 8 9 percent or minus two percent, except each branch campus shall enroll 10 within plus or minus twelve percent. If the estimated 1991-93 average biennial full time equivalent student enrollment of an institution or 11 branch campus (as estimated on April 30, 1993, by the office of 12 financial management using spring enrollment reports submitted by the 13 14 institutions) varies from the biennial budgeted amount by more than four percent above or two percent below the budgeted amount, or twelve 15 percent above or below the budgeted amount for each branch campus, then 16 17 an amount equal to the student quality standard multiplied by the 18 number of full time equivalent students above or below the variances 19 shall revert to the state general fund. The variance allowance for the 20 state board for community and technical colleges excludes the technical colleges. 21
