- 1 AN ACT Relating to transportation facilities of first class cities;
- 2 and amending RCW 35.92.060.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 35.92.060 and 1990 c 43 s 49 are each amended to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 A city or town may also construct, condemn and purchase, purchase,
- 7 acquire, add to, alter, maintain, operate, or lease cable, electric,
- 8 and other railways, automobiles, motor cars, motor buses, auto trucks,
- 9 and any and all other forms or methods of transportation of freight or
- 10 passengers within the corporate limits of the city or town, and a first
- 11 class city may also construct, purchase, acquire, add to, alter,
- 12 maintain, operate ((such forms or methods of transportation)), or lease
- 13 <u>cable</u>, <u>electric</u>, <u>and other railways</u> beyond ((the)) <u>those</u> corporate
- 14 limits ((of the city but not beyond)) only within the boundaries of the
- 15 county in which the city is located and of any adjoining county that

- 1 has a population of at least forty thousand and fewer than one hundred
- 2 twenty-five thousand and that is intersected by an interstate highway,
- 3 for the transportation of freight and passengers above, upon, or
- 4 underneath the ground. It may also fix, alter, regulate, and control
- 5 the fares and rates to be charged therefor; and fares or rates may be
- 6 adjusted or eliminated for any distinguishable class of users
- 7 including, but not limited to, senior citizens, handicapped persons,
- 8 and students. Without the payment of any license fee or tax, or the
- 9 filing of a bond with, or the securing of a permit from, the state, or
- 10 any department thereof, the city or town may engage in, carry on, and
- 11 operate the business of transporting and carrying passengers or freight
- 12 for hire by any method or combination of methods that the legislative
- 13 authority of any city or town may by ordinance provide, with full
- 14 authority to regulate and control the use and operation of vehicles or
- 15 other agencies of transportation used for such business.
