1 AN ACT Relating to the Erwin O. Rieger Memorial Highway; and
2 amending RCW 47.17.640.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.17.640 and 1984 c 7 s 136 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 A state highway to be known as state route number 501 is
7 established as follows:

8 Beginning at a junction with state route number 5 at Vancouver,
9 thence northerly by way of ((the)) Lower River Road and an extension
10 thereof to Ridgefield, thence easterly to a junction with state route
11 number 5 in the vicinity south of La Center. That portion of state
12 route number 501 from the northerly junction of N.W. Lower River Road
13 to the Ridgefield city limits is designated "the Erwin O. Rieger
14 Memorial Highway." The department may enter into an agreement with the
15 Port of Vancouver, ((and/or)) Clark county ((and/or)), or the United

1 States Army Engineers, or any combination thereof, to obtain material
2 dredged from the Columbia river and have it stockpiled at no expense to
3 the state.
