1 AN ACT Relating to study of the Holocaust; and adding a new section
2 to chapter 28A.300 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
5 RCW to read as follows:

6 (1) Every public high school is encouraged to include in its
7 curriculum instruction on the events of the period in modern world
8 history known as the Holocaust, during which six million Jews and
9 millions of non-Jews were exterminated. The instruction may also
10 include other examples from both ancient and modern history where
11 subcultures or large human populations have been eradicated by the acts
12 of humankind. The studying of this material is a reaffirmation of the
13 commitment of free peoples never again to permit such occurrences.

1 (2) The superintendent of public instruction may prepare and make
2 available to all school districts instructional materials for use as
3 guidelines for instruction under this section.
