# SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2370

### AS AMENDED BY THE SENATE

1 AN ACT Relating to registration of process servers; adding a new 2 chapter to Title 18 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 36.22 RCW; and 3 creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) A person who serves legal process 6 for a fee in the state of Washington shall register as a process server 7 with the auditor of the county in which the process server resides or 8 operates his or her principal place of business.

9 (2) The requirement to register under subsection (1) of this 10 section does not apply to any of the following persons:

(a) A sheriff, deputy sheriff, marshall, constable, or government
employee who is acting in the course of employment;

(b) An attorney or the attorney's employees, who are not servingprocess on a fee basis;

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(c) A person who is court appointed to serve the court's process;
 (d) An employee of a person who is registered under this section;
 (e) A person who does not receive a fee or wage for serving
 process.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 36.22 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 (1) Each county auditor shall develop a registration process to
8 register process servers required to register under section 1 of this
9 act.

(2) The county auditor may collect an annual registration fee fromthe process server not to exceed ten dollars.

12 (3) The office of the administrator for the courts shall develop a 13 registration form for the county auditors to use in the registration 14 process for the purpose of identifying and locating the registrant, 15 including the process server's name, birthdate, and social security 16 number, and the process server's business name, business address, and 17 business telephone number.

18 (4) The county auditor shall maintain a register of process servers 19 and assign a number to each registrant. Upon renewal of the 20 registration as required in section 3 of this act, the auditor shall 21 continue to assign the same registration number. A successor entity 22 composed of one or more registrants shall be permitted to transfer one 23 or more registration numbers to the new entity.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A process server required to register 25 under section 1 of this act must renew the registration within one year 26 of the date of the initial registration or when the registrant changes 27 his or her name, the name of his or her business, business address, or 28 business telephone number, whichever occurs sooner. If the renewal is 27 SHB 2370.SL p. 2 of 4 required because of a change in the information identifying the process
 server, the process server must renew the registration within ten days
 of the date the identifying information changes. The process server
 shall pay the registration fee upon renewal.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. (1) A process server required to 6 register under section 1 of this act shall indicate the process 7 server's registration number and the process server's county of 8 registration on any proof of service the process server signs.

9 (2) Employees of a process server required to register under 10 section 1 of this act shall indicate the employer's registration number 11 and the employer's county of registration on any proof of service the 12 registrant's employee signs.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) 14 of this section, any person who is otherwise entitled to collect the 15 costs of service of process shall not be entitled to collect those 16 costs if the person does not use a process server who under this 17 chapter either is required to register or is exempt from the 18 registration requirement.

19 (2) The person may collect the costs of the service of process if 20 the process server registers within forty-five days after serving the 21 process.

(3) This section shall apply to all process served on or afterAugust 1, 1992.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. Sections 1 and 3 through 5 of this act 25 shall constitute a new chapter in Title 18 RCW.
