- 1 AN ACT Relating to railroad crossing inspection fees; and amending
- 2 RCW 81.54.030.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 81.54.030 and 1961 c 14 s 81.54.030 are each amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Every person operating any logging railroad or industrial railway
- 7 shall, prior to July 1st of each year, file with the commission a
- 8 statement showing the number of, and location, by name of highway,
- 9 quarter section, section, township, and range of all crossings on his
- 10 line and pay with the filing a fee ((not to exceed ten dollars)) for
- 11 each crossing so reported. The commission shall, by order, fix the
- 12 exact fee based on the cost of rendering such inspection service. All
- 13 fees collected shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit
- 14 of the public service revolving fund. Intersections having one or more
- 15 tracks shall be treated as a single crossing. Tracks separated a

- 1 distance in excess of one hundred feet from the nearest track or group
- 2 of tracks shall constitute an additional crossing. Where two or more
- 3 independently operated railroads cross each other or the same highway
- 4 intersection, each independent track shall constitute a separate
- 5 crossing.
- 6 Every person failing to make the report and pay the fees required,
- 7 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and in addition be subject to a
- 8 penalty of twenty-five dollars for each day that the fee remains unpaid
- 9 after it becomes due.
