Read first time January 28, 1991. Referred to Committee on Transportation.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to a valid driver's license; and amending RCW
- 2 46.20.021 and 46.25.070.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.021 and 1990 c 250 s 33 are each amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) No person, except as expressly exempted by this chapter, may
- 7 drive any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless the
- 8 person has a valid driver's license issued to Washington residents
- 9 under the provisions of this chapter. A violation of this
- 10 subsection is a misdemeanor and is a lesser included offense within
- 11 the offenses described in RCW 46.20.342(1), 46.20.420, and
- 12 46.65.090.

- 1 (2) For the purposes of obtaining a valid driver's license, a
- 2 resident is a person who manifests an intent to live or be located
- 3 in this state on more than a temporary or transient basis. Evidence
- 4 <u>of residency includes but is not limited to:</u>
- 5 (a) Becoming a registered voter in this state; or
- 6 (b) Receiving benefits under one of the Washington public
- 7 assistance programs; or
- 8 (c) Declaring that he or she is a resident for the purpose of
- 9 <u>obtaining a state license or tuition fees at resident rates.</u>
- 10 (3) The term "Washington public assistance programs" referred to
- 11 <u>in subsection (2)(b) of this section includes only public assistance</u>
- 12 programs for which more than fifty percent of the combined costs of
- 13 <u>benefits and administration are paid from state funds</u>. <u>Programs</u>
- 14 which are not included within the term "Washington public assistance
- 15 programs" pursuant to the above criteria include, but are not
- 16 limited to the food stamp program under the federal food stamp act
- 17 of 1964; programs under the child nutrition act of 1966, 42 U.S.C.
- 18 Secs. 1771 through 1788; and aid to families with dependent
- 19 children, 42 U.S.C. Secs. 601 through 606.
- 20 (4) No person shall receive a driver's license unless and until
- 21 he or she surrenders to the department all valid driver's licenses
- 22 in his or her possession issued to him or her by any other
- 23 jurisdiction. The department shall establish a procedure to
- 24 invalidate the surrendered photograph license and return it to the
- 25 person. The invalidated license, along with the valid temporary
- 26 Washington driver's license provided for in RCW 46.20.055(3), shall
- 27 be accepted as proper identification. The department shall notify

- 1 the issuing department that the licensee is now licensed in a new
- 2 jurisdiction. No person shall be permitted to have more than one
- 3 valid driver's license at any time.
- 4 ((<del>(3)</del>)) (5) New Washington residents are allowed thirty days from
- 5 the date they become residents as defined in this section to procure
- 6 <u>a valid Washington driver's license.</u>
- 7 (6) Any person licensed as a driver under this chapter may
- 8 exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and highways
- 9 in this state and shall not be required to obtain any other license
- 10 to exercise such privilege by any county, municipal or local board,
- 11 or body having authority to adopt local police regulations.
- 12 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.25.070 and 1989 c 178 s 9 are each amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 (1) The application for a commercial driver's license or
- 15 commercial driver's instruction permit must include the following:
- 16 (a) The full name and current mailing and residential address of
- 17 the person;
- 18 (b) A physical description of the person, including sex, height,
- 19 weight, and eye color;
- 20 (c) Date of birth;
- 21 (d) The applicant's Social Security number;
- (e) The person's signature;
- 23 (f) Certifications including those required by 49 C.F.R. part
- 24 383.71(a);
- 25 (g) Proof of certification of physical examination or waiver, as
- 26 required by 49 C.F.R. 391.41 through 391.49;

- 1 (h) Any other information required by the department; and
- 2 (i) A consent to release driving record information to parties
- 3 identified in chapter 46.52 RCW and this chapter.
- 4 (2) When a licensee changes his or her name, mailing address, or
- 5 residence address, the person shall notify the department as
- 6 provided in RCW 46.20.205.
- 7 (3) ((A driver of a commercial motor vehicle shall immediately
- 8 apply for a driver's license upon becoming a resident of this
- 9 state.)) No person who has been a resident of this state for thirty
- 10 days may drive a commercial motor vehicle under the authority of a
- 11 commercial driver's license issued by another jurisdiction.
