1 AN ACT Relating to the school for the deaf and the school for the
2 blind; adding a new section to chapter 72.40 RCW; repealing RCW
3 72.40.115; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 72.40 RCW
6 to read as follows:

7 Any appropriation for the school for the deaf or the school for the
8 blind shall be made directly to the school for the deaf or the school
9 for the blind.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** RCW 72.40.115 and 1985 c 378 s 26 are
11 each repealed.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** This act is necessary for the immediate
13 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

1 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
2 effect July 1, 1991.
