1            AN ACT Relating to higher education tuition waivers; amending RCW  
2 28B.10.016, 28B.10.265, 28B.15.067, 28B.15.070, 28B.15.202, 28B.15.225,  
3 28B.15.380, 28B.15.402, 28B.15.502, 28B.15.520, 28B.15.522, 28B.15.527,  
4 28B.15.535, 28B.15.540, 28B.15.543, 28B.15.545, 28B.15.556, 28B.15.558,  
5 28B.15.615, 28B.15.620, 28B.15.628, 28B.15.725, 28B.15.730, 28B.15.740,  
6 28B.15.750, 28B.15.756, 28B.50.259, 28B.70.050, 28B.80.580, and  
7 82.33.020; reenacting and amending RCW 28B.15.014 and 28B.15.100;  
8 adding a new section to chapter 28B.15 RCW; and providing an effective

1 (1) "State universities" means the University of Washington and  
2 Washington State University.

3 (2) "Regional universities" means Western Washington University at  
4 Bellingham, Central Washington University at Ellensburg, and Eastern  
5 Washington University at Cheney.

6 (3) "State college" means The Evergreen State College in Thurston  
7 county.

8 (4) "Institutions of higher education" or "postsecondary  
9 institutions" means the state universities, the regional universities,  
10 The Evergreen State College, the community colleges, and the technical  
11 colleges.

12 (5) "Governing board" means the board of regents or the board of  
13 trustees of the institutions of higher education.

14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.10.265 and 1985 c 390 s 1 are each amended to read  
15 as follows:

16 Subject to the limitations of section 33 of this act, the governing  
17 boards of the state universities, the regional universities, The  
18 Evergreen State College, and the community colleges may waive all or a  
19 portion of the tuition, operating, and services and activities fees for  
20 children of any person who was a Washington domiciliary and who within  
21 the past eleven years has been determined by the federal government to  
22 be a prisoner of war or missing in action in Southeast Asia, including  
23 Korea, or who shall become so hereafter(~~(, shall be admitted to and~~  
24 ~~attend any public institution of higher education within the state~~  
25 ~~without the necessity of paying any tuition and service and activities'~~  
26 ~~fees for any and all courses offered at any time including summer term~~  
27 ~~whether attending on a part time or full time basis: PROVIDED, That~~  
28 ~~such child shall))~~, if the children meet such other educational  
29 qualifications as such institution of higher education shall deem

1 reasonable and necessary under the circumstances. ((Affected  
2 institutions shall in their preparation of future budgets include  
3 therein costs resultant from such tuition loss for reimbursement  
4 thereof from appropriations of state funds.)) Applicants for free or  
5 reduced tuition shall provide institutional administrative personnel  
6 with documentation of their rights under this section.

9 required in operating fee foregone revenue from tuition waivers in the  
10 biennial state appropriations act.

17 portion of the nonresident tuition ((and)) fees differential:

18 (1) Any person who resides in the state of Washington and who holds  
19 a graduate service appointment designated as such by a public  
20 institution of higher education or is employed for an academic
