1            AN ACT Relating to television reception improvement districts; and  
2 amending RCW 36.95.060.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.95.060 and 1971 ex.s. c 155 s 6 are each amended to  
5 read as follows:

6            The business of the district shall be conducted by the board of the  
7 television reception improvement district, hereinafter referred to as  
8 the "board". The board shall be constituted as provided under either  
9 subsection (1) or (2) of this section.

10            (1) The board of a district having boundaries different from the  
11 county's shall have either three, five, seven, or nine members, as  
12 determined by the board of county commissioners at the time the  
13 district is created. Each member shall (~~be appointed by the board of~~  
14 ~~county commissioners, shall~~) reside within the boundaries of the

1 district and (~~each shall serve a three year term~~) shall be appointed  
2 by the board of county commissioners for a term of three years, or  
3 until (~~their successors are~~) his or her successor has qualified,  
4 except that the board of county commissioners shall appoint one of the  
5 members of the first board to a one-year term and two to two-year  
6 terms. There is no limit upon the number of terms to which a member  
7 may be reappointed after his or her first appointment. A majority of  
8 the members of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction  
9 of business, but the majority vote of the board members shall be  
10 necessary for any action taken by the board. The board shall elect  
11 from among its members a chairman and such other officers as may be  
12 necessary. In the event a seat on the board is vacated prior to the  
13 expiration of the term of the member appointed to such seat, the board  
14 of county commissioners shall appoint a person to complete (~~such~~) the  
15 unexpired term.

16 (2) Upon the creation of a district having boundaries identical to  
17 those of the county (a county-wide district), the county commissioners  
18 shall be the members of the board of the district and shall have all  
19 the powers and duties of (~~such~~) the board as provided under the other  
20 sections of this chapter. The county commissioners shall be reimbursed  
21 pursuant to the provisions of RCW 36.95.070, and shall conduct the  
22 business of the district according to the regular rules and procedures  
23 applicable to meetings of the board of county commissioners.
