1 AN ACT Relating to school districts' boards of directors; and 2 amending RCW 28A.315.530.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.315.530 and 1975 1st ex.s. c 275 s 100 are each 5 amended to read as follows:

6 (1) In case of a vacancy from any cause on the board of directors 7 of a school district other than a reconstituted board resulting from reorganized school districts, a majority of the legally established 8 9 number of board members shall fill such vacancy by appointment: PROVIDED, That should there exist fewer board members on the board of 10 11 directors of a school district than constitutes a majority of the legally established number of board members, the educational service 12 district board members of the district in which the school district is 13 14 located by the vote of a majority of its legally established number of 15 board members shall appoint a sufficient number of board members to

constitute a legal majority on the board of directors of such school 1 2 district; and the remaining vacancies on such board of directors shall 3 be filled by such board of directors in accordance with the provisions of this section: PROVIDED FURTHER, That should any board of directors 4 for whatever reason fail to fill a vacancy within ninety days from the 5 6 creation of such vacancy, the members of the educational service district board of the district in which the school district is located 7 by majority vote shall fill such vacancy. 8

9 (2) Appointees to fill vacancies on boards of directors of school 10 districts shall meet the requirements provided by law for school 11 directors and shall serve until the next regular school district 12 election, at which time a successor shall be elected for the unexpired 13 term.

14 <u>(3) If a vacancy will be created by a board member who has</u> 15 <u>submitted a resignation, that board member may not vote on the</u> 16 <u>selection of his or her replacement.</u>
