- AN ACT Relating to convention facilities; amending RCW 67.28.080;
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 67.28 RCW; adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 36.32 RCW; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 67.28.080 and 1967 c 236 s 1 are each amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 In any county located in whole or in part in a national scenic area
- 8 and the population of which county is less than 20,000, a convention
- 9 center facility may include a hotel, destination resort, conference
- 10 center, or similar or related facility. A convention center facility
- 11 may include the land on which any of the foregoing structures or
- 12 facilities are sited. A convention center facility may also include
- 13 land necessary for the operation of a convention center facility.
- 14 "Municipality" as used in this chapter means any county, city or
- 15 town of the state of Washington.

- 1 "Person" as used in this chapter means the federal government or
- 2 any agency thereof, the state or any agency, subdivision, taxing
- 3 district or municipal corporation thereof other than county, city or
- 4 town, any private corporation, partnership, association, or individual.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 67.28 RCW
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The provisions of this section shall apply to any municipality in
- 8 any county located in whole or in part in a national scenic area when
- 9 the population of the county is less than 20,000. The provisions of
- 10 this section shall also apply to the county when the county contains in
- 11 whole or in part a national scenic area and the population of the
- 12 county is less than 20,000.
- 13 (1) The legislative body of any municipality or the county
- 14 legislative authority is authorized to sell to any public or private
- 15 person, including a corporation, partnership, joint venture, or any
- 16 other business entity, any convention center facility it owns in whole
- 17 or in part.
- 18 (2) The price and other terms and conditions shall be as the
- 19 legislative body or authority shall determine.
- 20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 36.32 RCW
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 RCW 36.32.240, 36.32.250, and 36.32.260 do not apply to the
- 23 selection of persons or entities in respect to convention centers
- 24 undertaken under chapter 67.28 RCW by a county located in whole or in
- 25 part in a national scenic area and the population of which is less than
- 26 twenty thousand.
- This section shall expire June 30, 1996.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 67.28 RCW
- 2 to read as follows:
- In addition to the other uses authorized in this chapter, any city
- 4 with a population of not less than one thousand people located on one
- 5 of the San Juan islands or the county within which such city is located
- 6 may impose the tax and use the tax proceeds provided herein for the
- 7 acquisition, construction, or operation of publicly owned facilities
- 8 that are used either for county fairs occurring no more than once a
- 9 year and not extending over a period of more than seven days or to
- 10 mitigate the impacts of tourism.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 12 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 13 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 14 effect after immediately. This act applies retroactively to all
- 15 actions taken under chapter 67.28 RCW on or after January 1, 1990.
