- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 29.18 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (1) A person filing a declaration and affidavit of candidacy for an
- 9 office shall, at the time of filing, possess the qualifications
- 10 specified by law for persons who may be elected to the office.
- 11 (2) The name of a candidate for an office shall not appear on a
- 12 ballot for that office unless the candidate is, at the time the
- 13 candidate's declaration and affidavit of candidacy is filed, properly
- 14 registered to vote in the geographic area represented by the office.
- 15 For the purposes of this section, each geographic area in which

- 1 registered voters may cast ballots for an office is represented by that
- 2 office. If a person elected to an office must be nominated from a
- 3 district or similar division of the geographic area represented by the
- 4 office, the name of a candidate for the office shall not appear on a
- 5 primary ballot for that office unless the candidate is, at the time the
- 6 candidate's declaration and affidavit of candidacy is filed, properly
- 7 registered to vote in that district or division. The officer with whom
- 8 declarations and affidavits of candidacy must be filed under this title
- 9 shall review each such declaration filed regarding compliance with this
- 10 subsection.
- 11 (3) This section does not apply to the office of a member of the
- 12 United States congress.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 29.04 RCW
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (1) The legislative authority of each county and each city, town,
- 16 and special purpose district which lies entirely within the county
- 17 shall provide the county auditor accurate information describing its
- 18 geographical boundaries and the boundaries of its director, council, or
- 19 commissioner districts and shall ensure that the information provided
- 20 to the auditor is kept current.
- 21 (2) A city, town, or special purpose district that lies in more
- 22 than one county shall provide the secretary of state accurate
- 23 information describing its geographical boundaries and the boundaries
- 24 of its director, council, or commissioner districts and shall ensure
- 25 that the information provided to the secretary is kept current. The
- 26 secretary of state shall promptly transmit to each county in which a
- 27 city, town, or special purpose district is located information
- 28 regarding the boundaries of that jurisdiction which is provided to the
- 29 secretary.
