1 AN ACT Relating to taillights on old vehicles; and amending RCW
2 46.37.100.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.37.100 and 1961 c 12 s 46.37.100 are each amended
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) Front clearance lamps and those marker lamps and reflectors
7 mounted on the front or on the side near the front of a vehicle shall
8 display or reflect an amber color.

9 (2) Rear clearance lamps and those marker lamps and reflectors
10 mounted on the rear or on the sides near the rear of a vehicle shall
11 display or reflect a red color.

12 (3) All lighting devices and reflectors mounted on the rear of any
13 vehicle shall display or reflect a red color, except the stop lamp or
14 other signal device, which may be red, amber, or yellow, and except

1 that on any vehicle forty or more years old, the taillight may also
2 contain a blue or purple insert of not more than one inch in diameter,
3 and except that the light illuminating the license plate shall be white
4 and the light emitted by a back-up lamp shall be white or amber.
