- 3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 3.34.100 and 1984 c 258 s 16 are each amended to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 If a district judge dies, resigns, is convicted of a felony, ceases
- 6 to reside in the district, fails to serve for any reason except
- 7 temporary disability, or if his or her term of office is terminated in
- 8 any other manner, the office shall be deemed vacant. The county
- 9 legislative authority shall fill all vacancies by appointment and the
- 10 judge thus appointed shall hold office until the next general election
- 11 and until a successor is elected and qualified. District judges shall
- 12 be granted sick leave in the same manner as other county employees. \underline{A}
- 13 <u>district judge may receive when vacating office remuneration for unused</u>
- 14 accumulated leave and sick leave at a rate equal to one day's monetary

- 1 compensation for each full day of accrued leave and one day's monetary
- 2 compensation for each four full days of accrued sick leave, the total
- 3 remuneration for leave and sick leave not to exceed the equivalent of
