HB 1960-S.E - DIGEST

(DIGEST AS ENACTED)

Declares that the use of a nontraditional modality by itself shall not constitute unprofessional conduct.

Provides for temporary practice permits for various professions.

Requires the establishment of a state-wide health personnel resource plan.

Revises provisions of the health professional loan repayment and scholarship program.

Specifies the required service obligations.

Creates the health professional loan repayment and scholarship program fund.

Provides for credentialing of certain applicants holding a credential from another state.

Provides that the act shall be null and void if appropriations are not approved.

VETO MESSAGE ON 1960-S

May 21, 1991

To the Honorable, the House of Representatives of the

State of Washington

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am returning herewith, without my approval as to section 35, Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 1960 entitled:

"AN ACT Relating to health professions regulation."

Subsections (2) through (11) within section 35 of this bill chapter 28B.102 RCW, the Future Teachers Conditional Scholarship Program. I understand this was done in error, and that the sponsor's intent to repeal chapter 28B.104 RCW, the Nurses Conditional Scholarship Program. I cannot veto these subsections without also vetoing the other subsections of this section, and I will not sign legislation which would repeal the Teachers Scholarship Program. While I must veto section 35, I recognize that such action will leave in law conflicting provisions regarding health professional loan repayment programs. Subsequent legislation will be needed to eliminate these conflicts.

With the exception of section 35, Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 1960 is approved.
