12 <u>The legislative transportation committee has adopted</u> 13 <u>recommendations and taken specific legislative action to improve the</u> 14 <u>department of licensing service delivery, as well as other</u> 15 transportation agencies' services.

16 The legislature has recognized the need to improve the department 17 of licensing service-delivery system, specifically driver and vehicle licensing services. The legislature has provided funding for three 18 19 separate strategic initiatives to enhance the department of licensing 20 and other transportation related services offered to the public. The 21 legislature, in this and previous legislative sessions, has provided 22 funding for: (a) The licensing application migration project (LAMP); 23 (b) a capital budget program; and (c) the reclassification of licensing personnel. The legislature funded these three strategic initiatives to 24 25 improve services to the public.

Recognizing the significant changes required throughout the 26 department as a result of the licensing application migration project, 27 the new capital budget program, and the reclassification of licensing 28 personnel, the legislature finds there is a need to develop a 29 comprehensive strategic plan to establish the foundation for future 30 changes which will be required to maximize productivity improvements 31 associated with the three strategic initiatives, and to maximize 32 customer service-delivery improvements. 33 34 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following

35 conditions and limitations:

(1)(a) By May 1, 1994, the department shall provide the legislative
 transportation committee and the office of financial management with a
 workplan for the development of a strategic initiatives plan.
