7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that most additives do not have a positive effect on the operation of on-site systems and 8 can contaminate ground water aquifers, render septic drainfields 9 dysfunctional, and result in costly repairs to homeowners. 10 It is therefore the intent of the legislature to ban the use, sale, and 11 12 distribution of additives within the state unless an additive has been specifically approved by the department of health. 13

14 Sec. 2. RCW 70.118.020 and 1991 c 3 s 367 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

16 As used in this chapter, the terms defined in this section shall have the meanings indicated unless the context clearly indicates 17 18 otherwise.

(1) "Nonwater-carried sewage disposal devices" means any device 19 20 that stores and treats nonwater-carried human urine and feces.

21 (2) "Alternative methods of effluent disposal" means systems 22 approved by the department of health, including at least, mound 23 alternating drain fields, systems, anaerobic filters, evapotranspiration systems, and aerobic systems. 24

25 (3) "Failure" means: (a) Effluent has been discharged on the 26 surface of the ground prior to approved treatment; or (b) effluent has percolated to the surface of the ground; or (c) effluent has 27 contaminated or threatens to contaminate a ground water supply. 28

29 (4) "Additive" means any commercial product intended to affect the 30 internal performance or aesthetics of an on-site sewage disposal 31 system.

(5) "Department" means the department of health. 32

(6) "<u>On-site sewage disposal system</u>" means any system of piping, 33 treatment devices, or other facilities that convey, store, treat, or 34 35 dispose of sewage on the property where it originates or on nearby

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property under the control of the user where the system is not connected to a public sewer system. For purposes of this chapter, an on-site sewage disposal system does not include indoor plumbing and associated fixtures.

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 70.118 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 (1) After July 1, 1994, a person may not use, sell, or distribute an additive to on-site sewage disposal systems unless such additive has 8 9 been specifically approved by the department. The department may approve an additive if it can be demonstrated to the satisfaction of 10 the department that the additive has a positive benefit, and no adverse 11 12 effect, on the operation or performance of an on-site sewage system. Upon written request by an additive manufacturer or distributor for 13 14 product evaluation, the department may charge a fee sufficient to cover 15 the costs of evaluating the additive, including the development of standards and review procedures. 16

(2) The attorney general or appropriate city or county prosecuting 17 18 attorney is authorized to bring an appropriate action to enjoin any 19 violation of the prohibition on the sale or distribution of additives. is responsible for providing written 20 (3) The department notification to major distributors and wholesalers of additives of the 21 22 state-wide prohibition on additives. The notification shall be 23 provided no later than October 1, 1993. Within thirty days of 24 notification from the department, distributors and wholesalers shall 25 provide the same notification to their retail customers. The department shall also provide notification to major distributors and 26 wholesalers of additive products that have been approved." 27
