6 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 604. A new section is added to chapter 18.130
7 RCW to read as follows:

8 (1) The settlement process must be substantially uniform for
9 licensees governed by regulatory entities having authority under this
10 chapter.

11 (2) Disclosure of the identity of reviewing disciplining authority
12 members who participate in the settlement process is available to the
13 respondents or their legal representative upon request.

14 (3) The settlement conference will occur only if a settlement is
15 not achieved through written documents. Respondents will have the
16 opportunity to conference either by phone or in person with the
17 reviewing disciplining authority member if the respondent chooses.
18 Respondents may also have their attorney conference either by phone or
19 in person with the reviewing disciplining authority member without the
20 respondent being present personally.

21 (4) If the respondent wants to meet in person with the reviewing
22 disciplining authority member, he or she will travel to the reviewing
23 disciplinary authority member and have such a conference with the
24 attorney general in attendance either by phone or in person."

5 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 872.** The legislature declares there has been
6 an excessive proliferation of boards and commissions within state
7 government. These boards and commissions are often created without
8 legislative review or input and without an assessment of whether there
9 is a resulting duplication of purpose or process. Once created, they
10 frequently duplicate the duties of existing governmental entities,
11 create additional expense, and obscure responsibility. It has been
12 difficult to control the growth of boards and commissions because of
13 the many special interests involved. Accordingly, the legislature
14 establishes the process in this chapter to eliminate redundant and
15 obsolete boards and commissions and to restrict the establishment of
16 new boards and commissions.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 873.** A new section is added to chapter 43.41
18 RCW to read as follows:

19 (1) The governor shall conduct a review of all of the boards and
20 commissions identified under section 874 of this act and, by January
21 8th of every odd-numbered year, submit to the legislature a report
22 recommending which boards and commissions should be terminated or
23 consolidated based upon the criteria set forth in subsection (3) of
24 this section. The report must state which of the criteria were relied
25 upon with respect to each recommendation. The governor shall submit an
26 executive request bill by January 8th of every odd-numbered year to
27 implement the recommendations by expressly terminating the appropriate
28 boards and commissions and by providing for the transfer of duties and
29 obligations under this section. The governor shall accept and review
30 with special attention recommendations made, not later than June 1st of
31 each even-numbered year, by the standing committees of the legislature
32 in determining whether to include any board or commission in the report
33 and bill required by this section.

34 (2) In addition to terminations and consolidations under subsection
35 (1) of this section, the governor may recommend the transfer of duties
36 and obligations from a board or commission to another existing state
37 entity.

1 (3) In preparing his or her report and legislation, the governor
2 shall make an evaluation based upon answers to the questions set forth
3 in this subsection. The governor shall give these criteria priority in
4 the order listed.

5 (a) Has the mission of the board or commission been completed or
6 ceased to be critical to effective state government?

7 (b) Does the work of the board or commission directly affect public
8 safety, welfare, or health?

9 (c) Can the work of the board or commission be effectively done by
10 another state agency without adverse impact on public safety, welfare,
11 or health?

12 (d) Will termination of the board or commission have a significant
13 adverse impact on state revenue because of loss of federal funds?

14 (e) Will termination of the board or commission save revenues, be
15 cost neutral, or result in greater expenditures?

16 (f) Is the work of the board or commission being done by another
17 board, commission, or state agency?

18 (g) Could the work of the board or commission be effectively done
19 by a nonpublic entity?

20 (h) Will termination of the board or commission result in a
21 significant loss of expertise to state government?

22 (i) Will termination of the board or commission result in
23 operational efficiencies that are other than fiscal in nature?

24 (j) Could the work of the board or commission be done by an ad hoc
25 committee?

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 874.** The boards and commissions to be reviewed
27 by the governor must be all entities that are required to be included
28 in the list prepared by the office of financial management under RCW
29 43.88.505, other than entities established under: (1) Constitutional
30 mandate; (2) court order or rule; (3) requirement of federal law; or
31 (4) requirement as a condition of the state or a local government
32 receiving federal financial assistance if, in the judgment of the
33 governor, no other state agency, board, or commission would satisfy the
34 requirement.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 875.** A new section is added to chapter 43.41
36 RCW to read as follows:

1 A new board or commission not established or required in statute
2 that must be included in the report required by RCW 43.88.505 may not
3 be established without the express approval of the director of
4 financial management. The director shall, by January 8th of each year,
5 submit to the legislature a list of those boards and commissions that
6 were requested for approval and those that were approved during the
7 preceding calendar year.

8 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 876.** A new section is added to chapter 43.41
9 RCW to read as follows:

10 When acting on a request to establish a new board or commission
11 under section 875 of this act, the director of the office of financial
12 management shall consider the following criteria giving priority in the
13 order listed:

14 (1) If approval is critical to public safety, health, or welfare or
15 to the effectiveness of state government;

16 (2) If approval will not result in duplication of the work or
17 responsibilities of another governmental agency;

18 (3) If approval will not have a significant impact on state
19 revenues;

20 (4) If approval is for a limited duration or on an ad hoc basis;

21 (5) If the work of the board or commission could be effectively
22 done by a nonpublic entity;

23 (6) If approval will result in significant enhancement of expertise
24 in state government; and

25 (7) If approval will result in operational efficiencies other than
26 fiscal savings.

27 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 877.** (1) Sections 872 through 876 of this act
28 are necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
29 health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing
30 public institutions, and shall take effect immediately."

1 On page 178, before line 1, insert the following:

2 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 872.** The Washington traffic safety commission
3 is hereby abolished and its powers, duties, and functions are hereby
4 transferred to the Washington state patrol.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 873.** All reports, documents, surveys, books,
6 records, files, papers, or written material in the possession of the
7 Washington traffic safety commission shall be delivered to the custody
8 of the Washington state patrol. All cabinets, furniture, office
9 equipment, motor vehicles, and other tangible property employed by the
10 Washington traffic safety commission shall be made available to the
11 Washington state patrol. All funds, credits, or other assets held by
12 the Washington traffic safety commission shall be assigned to the
13 Washington state patrol.

14 Any appropriations made to the Washington traffic safety commission
15 shall, on the effective date of this section, be transferred and
16 credited to the Washington state patrol.

17 Whenever any question arises as to the transfer of any personnel,
18 funds, books, documents, records, papers, files, equipment, or other
19 tangible property used or held in the exercise of the powers and the
20 performance of the duties and functions transferred, the director of
21 financial management shall make a determination as to the proper
22 allocation and certify the same to the state agencies concerned.

23 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 874.** All employees of the Washington traffic
24 safety commission are transferred to the jurisdiction of the Washington
25 state patrol. All employees classified under chapter 41.06 RCW, the
26 state civil service law, are assigned to the Washington state patrol to
27 perform their usual duties upon the same terms as formerly, without any
28 loss of rights, subject to any action that may be appropriate
29 thereafter in accordance with the laws and rules governing state civil
30 service.

31 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 875.** All rules and all pending business before
32 the Washington traffic safety commission shall be continued and acted
33 upon by the Washington state patrol. All existing contracts and
34 obligations shall remain in full force and shall be performed by the
35 Washington state patrol.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 876.** The transfer of the powers, duties,
2 functions, and personnel of the Washington traffic safety commission
3 shall not affect the validity of any act performed prior to the
4 effective date of this section.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 877.** If apportionments of budgeted funds are
6 required because of the transfers directed by sections 873 through 876
7 of this act, the director of financial management shall certify the
8 apportionments to the agencies affected, the state auditor, and the
9 state treasurer. Each of these shall make the appropriate transfer and
10 adjustments in funds and appropriation accounts and equipment records
11 in accordance with the certification.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 878.** Nothing contained in sections 872 through
13 877 of this act may be construed to alter any existing collective
14 bargaining unit or the provisions of any existing collective bargaining
15 agreement until the agreement has expired or until the bargaining unit
16 has been modified by action of the personnel board as provided by law.

17 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 879.** A new section is added to chapter 43.06
18 RCW to read as follows:

19 The governor shall be responsible for the administration of the
20 traffic safety program of the state and shall be the official of the
21 state having ultimate responsibility for dealing with the federal
22 government with respect to all programs and activities of the state and
23 local governments pursuant to the Highway Safety Act of 1966 (P.L. 89-
24 564; 80 Stat. 731). The governor is authorized and empowered to accept
25 and disburse federal grants or other funds or donations from any source
26 for the purpose of improving traffic safety programs in the state of
27 Washington, and is hereby empowered to contract and to do all other
28 things necessary in behalf of this state to secure the full benefits
29 available to this state under the federal Highway Safety Act of 1966
30 and in so doing, to cooperate with federal and state agencies, agencies
31 private and public, interested organizations, and with individuals, to
32 effectuate the purposes of that enactment, and any and all subsequent
33 amendments thereto. The governor shall be assisted in these duties and
34 responsibilities by the Washington state patrol.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 880.** A new section is added to chapter 43.06
2 RCW to read as follows:

3 The governor shall be assisted in the duties and responsibilities
4 under section 879 of this act by the advisory committee on traffic
5 safety. The advisory committee on traffic safety shall be composed of
6 the governor as chair, the superintendent of public instruction, the
7 director of licensing, the secretary of transportation, the chief of
8 the state patrol, the secretary of health, the secretary of social and
9 health services, a representative of the association of Washington
10 cities to be appointed by the governor, a member of the Washington
11 state association of counties to be appointed by the governor, a
12 representative of the judiciary to be appointed by the governor, and
13 four public citizens representing traffic safety interests to be
14 appointed by the governor. In addition, appointments to any vacancies
15 among appointee members shall be as in the case of original
16 appointment.

17 The governor or any advisory committee member except those
18 appointed by the governor under this section may designate an employee
19 of his or her office or agency to act on his or her behalf during the
20 absence of the governor or member at one or more of the meetings of the
21 committee. The vote of the designee shall have the same effect as if
22 cast by the member if the designation is in writing and is presented to
23 the person presiding at the meetings included within the designation.

24 The governor may designate a member to preside during the
25 governor's absence.

26 The chief of the state patrol shall be responsible for convening
27 the committee and shall serve as secretary.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 881.** A new section is added to chapter 43.06
29 RCW to read as follows:

30 The advisory committee on traffic safety shall provide assistance
31 and guidance in the development of the highway safety plan required
32 pursuant to the Highway Safety Act of 1966; develop recommendations for
33 the creation, revision, or enforcement of traffic safety laws; promote
34 programs to improve traffic safety; and advise and assist the governor
35 and the state patrol, as requested, in carrying out their duties and
36 responsibilities pertaining to the state's traffic safety program.
37 Staff support for the committee shall be provided by the state patrol.
38 The committee shall meet at least one time per year.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 882.** A new section is added to chapter 43.43
2 RCW to read as follows:

3 In addition to other responsibilities set forth in this chapter the
4 state patrol shall:

5 (1) Assist the governor to carry out duties and responsibilities
6 pertaining to the traffic safety program of the state and the Highway
7 Safety Act of 1966 (P.L. 89-564; 80 Stat. 731) as provided in section
8 879 of this act;

9 (2) Advise and confer with the governing authority of any political
10 subdivision of the state deemed eligible under the federal Highway
11 Safety Act of 1966 for participation in the aims and programs and
12 purposes of that act;

13 (3) Advise and confer with all agencies of state government whose
14 programs and activities are within the scope of the Highway Safety Act
15 including those agencies that are not subject to direct supervision,
16 administration, and control by the governor under existing laws;

17 (4) Provide staff support to the advisory committee on traffic
18 safety as provided under section 881 of this act;

19 (5) Succeed to and be vested with all powers, duties, and
20 jurisdictions previously vested in the Washington traffic safety
21 commission;

22 (6) Carry out such other responsibilities as may be consistent with
23 section 883 of this act.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 883.** A new section is added to chapter 43.43
25 RCW to read as follows:

26 The governor's traffic safety program as provided in section 879 of
27 this act shall be located in the office of the chief. As the agency
28 carrying out the governor's traffic safety program, the Washington
29 state patrol shall have the following responsibilities: To find
30 solutions to the problems that have been created as a result of the
31 tremendous increase of motor vehicles on our highways and the attendant
32 traffic death and accident tolls; to plan and supervise programs for
33 the prevention of accidents on streets and highways including but not
34 limited to educational campaigns designed to reduce traffic accidents
35 in cooperation with all official and unofficial organizations
36 interested in traffic safety; to coordinate the activities at the state
37 and local levels in the development of state-wide and local traffic
38 safety programs; to promote a uniform enforcement of traffic safety

1 laws and establish standards for investigation and reporting of traffic
2 accidents; to promote and improve driver education; and to authorize
3 the governor to perform all functions required to be performed under
4 the federal Highway Safety Act of 1966.

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 884.** A new section is added to chapter 43.43
6 RCW to read as follows:

7 The Washington state patrol shall submit a report each biennium
8 outlining programs planned and steps taken toward improving traffic
9 safety to the chair of the legislative transportation committee.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 885.** A new section is added to chapter 43.43
11 RCW to read as follows:

12 The Washington state patrol shall produce and disseminate through
13 all possible media, informational and educational materials explaining
14 the extent of the problems caused by drinking drivers, the need for
15 public involvement in their solution, and the penalties of existing and
16 new laws against driving while under the influence of intoxicating
17 liquor or any drug.

18 **Sec. 886.** RCW 28A.170.050 and 1987 c 518 s 209 are each amended to
19 read as follows:

20 The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a substance
21 abuse advisory committee comprised of: Representatives of certificated
22 and noncertificated staff; administrators; parents; students; school
23 directors; the bureau of alcohol and substance abuse within the
24 department of social and health services; the (~~traffic safety~~
25 ~~commission~~) Washington state patrol; and county coordinators of
26 alcohol and drug treatment. The committee shall advise the
27 superintendent on matters of local program development, coordination,
28 and evaluation.

29 **Sec. 887.** RCW 43.03.028 and 1993 c 281 s 45 and 1993 c 101 s 14
30 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

31 (1) There is hereby created a state committee on agency officials'
32 salaries to consist of seven members, or their designees, as follows:
33 The president of the University of Puget Sound; the chairperson of the
34 council of presidents of the state's four-year institutions of higher
35 education; the chairperson of the Washington personnel resources board;

1 the president of the Association of Washington Business; the president
2 of the Pacific Northwest Personnel Managers' Association; the president
3 of the Washington State Bar Association; and the president of the
4 Washington State Labor Council. If any of the titles or positions
5 mentioned in this subsection are changed or abolished, any person
6 occupying an equivalent or like position shall be qualified for
7 appointment by the governor to membership upon the committee.

8 (2) The committee shall study the duties and salaries of the
9 directors of the several departments and the members of the several
10 boards and commissions of state government, who are subject to
11 appointment by the governor or whose salaries are fixed by the
12 governor, and of the chief executive officers of the following agencies
13 of state government:

14 The arts commission; the human rights commission; the board of
15 accountancy; the board of pharmacy; the eastern Washington historical
16 society; the Washington state historical society; the interagency
17 committee for outdoor recreation; the criminal justice training
18 commission; the department of personnel; the state finance committee;
19 the state library; (~~the traffic safety commission;~~) the horse racing
20 commission; the advisory council on vocational education; the public
21 disclosure commission; the state conservation commission; the
22 commission on Hispanic affairs; the commission on Asian-American
23 affairs; the state board for volunteer fire fighters; the
24 transportation improvement board; the public employment relations
25 commission; the forest practices appeals board; and the energy
26 facilities site evaluation council.

27 The committee shall report to the governor or the chairperson of
28 the appropriate salary fixing authority at least once in each fiscal
29 biennium on such date as the governor may designate, but not later than
30 seventy-five days prior to the convening of each regular session of the
31 legislature during an odd-numbered year, its recommendations for the
32 salaries to be fixed for each position.

33 (3) Committee members shall be reimbursed by the department of
34 personnel for travel expenses under RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

35 **Sec. 888.** RCW 43.43.390 and 1991 c 214 s 1 are each amended to
36 read as follows:

37 Bicycling is increasing in popularity as a form of recreation and
38 as an alternative mode of transportation. To make bicycling safer, the

1 various law enforcement agencies should enforce traffic regulations for
2 bicyclists. By enforcing bicycle regulations, law enforcement officers
3 are reinforcing educational programs. Bicycling takes more skill than
4 most people realize. Since bicyclists have a low profile in traffic
5 and are unprotected, they need more defensive riding skills than
6 motorists do.

7 A bicycle awareness program is created within the Washington state
8 patrol. In developing the curriculum for the bicycle awareness program
9 the patrol shall consult with (~~the traffic safety commission and~~
10 ~~with~~) bicycling groups providing bicycle safety education. The patrol
11 shall conduct the program in conjunction with the safety education
12 officer program and may use other law enforcement personnel and
13 volunteers to implement the program for children in grades kindergarten
14 through six. The patrol shall ensure that each safety educator
15 presenting the bicycle awareness program has received specialized
16 training in bicycle safety education and has been trained in effective
17 defensive bicycle riding skills.

18 **Sec. 889.** RCW 43.70.410 and 1990 c 270 s 3 are each amended to
19 read as follows:

20 As used in RCW 43.70.400 through 43.70.440, the term "head injury"
21 means traumatic brain injury.

22 A head injury prevention program is created in the department of
23 health. The program's functions may be integrated with those of
24 similar programs to promote comprehensive, integrated, and effective
25 health promotion and disease prevention.

26 In consultation with the (~~traffic safety commission~~) Washington
27 state patrol, the department shall, directly or by contract, identify
28 and coordinate public education efforts currently underway within state
29 government and among private groups to prevent traumatic brain injury,
30 including, but not limited to, bicycle safety, pedestrian safety,
31 bicycle passenger seat safety, motorcycle safety, motor vehicle safety,
32 and sports safety. If the department finds that programs are not
33 available or not in use, it may, within funds appropriated for the
34 purpose, provide grants to promote public education efforts. Grants
35 may be awarded only after recipients have demonstrated coordination
36 with relevant and knowledgeable groups within their communities,
37 including at least schools, brain injury support organizations,
38 hospitals, physicians, traffic safety specialists, police, and the

1 public. The department may accept grants, gifts, and donations from
2 public or private sources to use to carry out the head injury
3 prevention program.

4 The department may assess or contract for the assessment of the
5 effectiveness of public education efforts coordinated or initiated by
6 any agency of state government. Agencies are directed to cooperate
7 with assessment efforts by providing access to data and program records
8 as reasonably required. The department may seek and receive additional
9 funds from the federal government or private sources for assessments.
10 Assessments shall contain findings and recommendations that will
11 improve the effectiveness of public education efforts. These findings
12 shall be distributed among public and private groups concerned with
13 traumatic brain injury prevention.

14 **Sec. 890.** RCW 43.70.420 and 1990 c 270 s 4 are each amended to
15 read as follows:

16 The department of health, the department of licensing, and the
17 (~~traffic safety commission~~) Washington state patrol shall jointly
18 prepare information for driver license manuals, driver education
19 programs, and driving tests to increase driver awareness of pedestrian
20 safety, to increase driver skills in avoiding pedestrian and motor
21 vehicle accidents, and to determine drivers' abilities to avoid
22 pedestrian motor vehicle accidents.

23 **Sec. 891.** RCW 44.40.070 and 1988 c 167 s 10 are each amended to
24 read as follows:

25 Prior to October 1st of each even-numbered year all state agencies
26 whose major programs consist of transportation activities, including
27 the department of transportation, the utilities and transportation
28 commission, the transportation improvement board, the Washington state
29 patrol, the department of licensing, (~~the traffic safety commission,~~)
30 the county road administration board, and the board of pilotage
31 commissioners, shall adopt or revise, after consultation with the
32 legislative transportation committee, a comprehensive six-year program
33 and financial plan for all transportation activities under each
34 agency's jurisdiction.

35 The comprehensive six-year program and financial plan shall state
36 the general objectives and needs of each agency's major transportation
37 programs, including workload and performance estimates.

1 **Sec. 892.** RCW 46.01.030 and 1990 c 250 s 14 are each amended to
2 read as follows:

3 The department shall be responsible for administering and
4 recommending the improvement of the motor vehicle laws of this state
5 relating to:

6 (1) driver examining and licensing;

7 (2) driver improvement;

8 (3) driver records;

9 (4) financial responsibility;

10 (5) certificates of ownership;

11 (6) certificates of license registration and license plates;

12 (7) proration and reciprocity;

13 (8) liquid fuel tax collections;

14 (9) licensing of dealers, motor vehicle transporters, motor vehicle
15 wreckers, for hire vehicles, and drivers' schools;

16 (10) general highway safety promotion in cooperation with the
17 Washington state patrol (~~and traffic safety commission~~);

18 (11) such other activities as the legislature may provide.

19 **Sec. 893.** RCW 46.52.120 and 1993 c 501 s 12 are each amended to
20 read as follows:

21 (1) The director shall keep a case record on every motor vehicle
22 driver licensed under the laws of this state, together with information
23 on each driver, showing all the convictions and findings of traffic
24 infractions certified by the courts, together with an index cross-
25 reference record of each accident reported relating to such individual
26 with a brief statement of the cause of the accident. The chief of the
27 Washington state patrol shall furnish the index cross-reference record
28 to the director, with reference to each driver involved in the reported
29 accidents.

30 (2) The records shall be for the confidential use of the director,
31 the chief of the Washington state patrol, (~~the director of the~~
32 ~~Washington traffic safety commission~~), and for such police officers or
33 other cognizant public officials as may be designated by law. Such
34 case records shall not be offered as evidence in any court except in
35 case appeal is taken from the order of the director, suspending,
36 revoking, canceling, or refusing a vehicle driver's license.

37 (3) The director shall tabulate and analyze vehicle driver's case
38 records and suspend, revoke, cancel, or refuse a vehicle driver's

1 license to a person when it is deemed from facts contained in the case
2 record of such person that it is for the best interest of public safety
3 that such person be denied the privilege of operating a motor vehicle.
4 Whenever the director orders the vehicle driver's license of any such
5 person suspended, revoked, or canceled, or refuses the issuance of a
6 vehicle driver's license, such suspension, revocation, cancellation, or
7 refusal is final and effective unless appeal from the decision of the
8 director is taken as provided by law.

9 **Sec. 894.** RCW 46.82.300 and 1984 c 287 s 93 are each amended to
10 read as follows:

11 (1) The director shall be assisted in the duties and
12 responsibilities of this chapter by the driver instructors' advisory
13 committee, consisting of five members. Members of the advisory
14 committee shall be appointed by the director for two-year terms and
15 shall consist of a representative of the driver training schools, a
16 representative of the driving instructors (who shall not be from the
17 same school as the school member), a representative of the
18 superintendent of public instruction, a representative of the
19 department of licensing, and a representative from the Washington state
20 (~~traffic safety commission~~) patrol. Members shall be reimbursed for
21 travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060. A
22 member who is receiving a salary from the state shall not receive
23 compensation other than travel expenses incurred in such service.

24 (2) The advisory committee shall meet at least semiannually and
25 shall have additional meetings as may be called by the director. The
26 director or the director's representative shall attend all meetings of
27 the advisory committee and shall serve as chairman.
