From time to time, but at least once each biennium, the director of licensing, after taking into account 26 past and anticipated claims for refunds from and deposits to the marine 27 fuel tax refund account and the costs of carrying out the provisions of 28 29 RCW 43.99.030, shall request the state treasurer to transfer ((an 30 amount equal to the proportion of the moneys in the account representing the motor vehicle fuel tax rate under RCW 82.36.025 in 31 effect on January 1, 1990, to the outdoor recreation account and the 32 33 remainder to the motor vehicle fund)) to the outdoor recreation account such of the moneys in the marine fuel tax refund account that are not 34 required for payment of the refund claims or costs, and the state 35 36 treasurer shall make the transfer.

1 **Sec. 57.** RCW 46.09.170 and 1990 c 42 s 115 are each amended to 2 read as follows:

3 (1) From time to time, but at least once each year, the state 4 treasurer shall refund from the motor vehicle fund one percent of the 5 motor vehicle fuel tax revenues collected under chapter 82.36 RCW, 6 ((based on the tax rate in effect January 1, 1990,)) less proper 7 deductions for refunds and costs of collection as provided in RCW 8 46.68.090. The treasurer shall place these funds in the general fund 9 as follows:

(v) Ten percent shall be transferred to the interagency committee for outdoor recreation for grants to law enforcement agencies in those counties where the department of natural resources maintains ORV facilities. This amount is in addition to those distributions made by the interagency committee for outdoor recreation under (d)(i) of this subsection;

30 (b) Three and one-half percent shall be credited to the ORV and 31 nonhighway vehicle account and administered by the department of 32 wildlife solely for the acquisition, planning, development, 33 maintenance, and management of nonhighway roads and recreation 34 facilities;

35 (c) Two percent shall be credited to the ORV and nonhighway vehicle 36 account and administered by the parks and recreation commission solely 37 for the maintenance and management of ORV use areas and facilities; and 38 (d) Fifty-four and one-half percent, together with the funds 39 received by the interagency committee for outdoor recreation under RCW

46.09.110, shall be credited to the outdoor recreation account to be administered by the committee for planning, acquisition, development, maintenance, and management of ORV recreation facilities and nonhighway road recreation facilities; ORV user education and information; and ORV law enforcement programs. The funds under this subsection shall be expended in accordance with the following limitations:

7 (i) Not more than twenty percent may be expended for ORV education,

9 (ii) Not less than an amount equal to the funds received by the 10 interagency committee for outdoor recreation under RCW 46.09.110 and 11 not more than sixty percent may be expended for ORV recreation 12 facilities;

(2) On a yearly basis an agency may not, except as provided in RCW
46.09.110, expend more than ten percent of the funds it receives under

19 **Sec. 58.** RCW 46.10.170 and 1990 c 42 s 117 are each amended to 20 read as follows:

From time to time, but at least once each biennium, the department 21 22 shall determine the amount or proportion of moneys paid to it as motor 23 vehicle fuel tax, ((based on the tax rate in effect January 1, 1990,)) 24 which is tax on snowmobile fuel. Such determination may be made in any 25 manner which is, in the judgment of the director, reasonable, but the manner used to make such determination shall be reported at the end of 26 each biennium to the legislature. To offset the actual cost of making 27 such determination the treasurer shall retain in, and the department is 28 29 authorized to expend from, the motor vehicle fund a sum equal to such 30 actual cost.
