- 1 AN ACT Relating to hunting and fishing licenses; and amending RCW
- 2 77.32.230 and 75.25.110.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 77.32.230 and 1991 sp.s. c 7 s 5 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) A person sixty-five years of age or older who is an honorably
 7 discharged veteran of the United States armed forces having a service8 connected disability and who has been a resident for five years may
 9 receive upon application a state hunting and fishing license free of
 10 charge.
- 11 (2) A blind person, or a person with a developmental disability as 12 defined in RCW 71A.10.020 with documentation of the disability from the 13 department of social and health services, or a physically handicapped 14 person confined to a wheelchair may receive upon application a fishing 15 license free of charge.
- 16 (3) A blind person or a physically handicapped person confined to 17 a wheelchair who has been issued a card for a permanent disability 18 under RCW 46.16.381 may use that card in place of a fishing license

- 1 unless tags, permits, stamps, or punchcards are required by this 2 chapter.
- 3 (4) A fishing license is not required for persons under the age of 4 fifteen.
- 5 (5) Tags, permits, stamps, and punchcards required by this chapter 6 shall be purchased separately by persons receiving a free or reduced-
- 7 fee license.
- 8 (6) Any honorably discharged veteran with a service-connected
- 9 disability of thirty percent or more as certified by the United States
- 10 <u>department of veterans' affairs or by any branch of the armed forces of</u>
- 11 the United States and who has resided in the state for not less than
- 12 one year shall receive upon application a hunting and fishing license
- 13 <u>free of charge.</u>
- 14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 75.25.110 and 1989 c 305 s 8 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- 16 (1) Any of the recreational fishing licenses required by this
- 17 chapter shall, upon request, be issued without charge to the following
- 18 individuals upon request:
- 19 (a) Residents under fifteen years of age and residents seventy
- 20 years of age or older;
- 21 (b) Residents who submit applications attesting that they are a
- 22 person sixty-five years of age or older who is an honorably discharged
- 23 veteran of the United States armed forces with a service-connected
- 24 disability and who has been a resident of this state for the preceding
- 25 ninety days;
- 26 (c) A blind person;
- 27 (d) A person with a developmental disability as defined in RCW
- 28 71A.10.020 with documentation of the disability from the department of
- 29 social and health services; ((and))
- 30 (e) A person who is physically handicapped and confined to a
- 31 wheelchair; and
- 32 (f) Any honorably discharged veteran with a service-connected
- 33 <u>disability of thirty percent or more as certified by the United States</u>
- 34 department of veterans' affairs or by any branch of the armed forces of
- 35 the United States and who has resided in the state for not less than
- 36 <u>one year</u>.

- 1 (2) Personal use licenses, salmon licenses, and sturgeon licenses 2 shall, upon request, be issued to nonresidents under fifteen years of 3 age.
- 4 (3) A blind person or a physically handicapped person confined to 5 a wheelchair who has been issued a card for a permanent disability 6 under RCW 46.16.381 may use that card in place of a fishing license 7 unless a punchcard is required by the director.
