- 1 AN ACT Relating to working hours for minors; amending RCW
- 2 49.12.121; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 49.12.121 and 1989 c 1 s 3 are each amended to read as 5 follows:
- 6 (1) The ((committee, or the director,)) department may at any time
- 7 inquire into wages, hours, and conditions of labor of minors employed
- 8 in any trade, business or occupation in the state of Washington and may
- 9 adopt special rules for the protection of the safety, health and
- 10 welfare of minor employees.
- 11 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, the hours of
- 12 employment for minors age sixteen and seventeen shall not be restricted
- 13 except as follows:
- 14 <u>(a) The total number of hours worked during the school year may not</u>
- 15 exceed:
- 16 (i) A maximum of six hours per day on any school day preceding
- 17 <u>another school day except Sundays, or otherwise a maximum of eight</u>
- 18 hours per day including Sundays;
- 19 (ii) A maximum of six days per week; or

- 1 (iii) A maximum of twenty hours per week.
- 2 (b) Employment during the school year may not:
- 3 (i) Begin earlier than 7:00 a.m. on a school day;
- 4 (ii) Begin earlier than 5:00 a.m. on Saturdays, Sundays, or school
- 5 holidays or vacations;
- 6 (iii) End later than 10:00 p.m. on any day preceding a school day;
- 7 <u>or</u>
- 8 (iv) End later than 12:00 a.m. on Fridays, Saturdays, and the day
- 9 preceding a school holiday or vacation.
- 10 (c) Minors may not work during school hours, unless the minor has
- 11 been excused from school attendance by the minor's school district
- 12 superintendent or her or his authorized agent, or the minor is in home-
- 13 based instruction under RCW 28A.225.010(4) and the employer keeps on
- 14 file a copy of the declaration of intent required under RCW
- 15 <u>28A.200.010.</u>
- 16 (d) The total number of hours worked during school vacations may
- 17 not exceed a maximum of eight hours per day or forty-eight hours per
- 18 <u>week.</u>
- 19 <u>(e) Employment during school vacations may not begin earlier than</u>
- 20 <u>5:00 a.m. or end later than 12:00 a.m.</u>
- 21 <u>(f) Minors employed past 8:00 p.m. in service occupations must be</u>
- 22 supervised by a responsible adult employee who is on the premises at
- 23 <u>all times</u>.
- 24 (3)(a) A variance to the requirements of subsection (2)(a)(iii) of
- 25 this section may be granted by the minor's school with concurrence of
- 26 the minor's parent or legal guardian. The department shall adopt rules
- 27 establishing the procedures that the school must follow in granting a
- 28 variance under this subsection. The variance may permit up to a
- 29 maximum of twenty-eight hours of work per week during the school year.
- 30 (b) Sixteen and seventeen-year-old minors who have been issued a
- 31 certificate of educational competence pursuant to RCW 28A.305.190, are
- 32 enrolled in a bona fide college program, are named on a valid
- 33 certificate of marriage, or are shown as the parent on a valid
- 34 certificate of birth may work as would be permitted during school
- 35 vacations.
- 36 (4) The minimum wage for minors shall be as prescribed in RCW
- 37 49.46.020.
- 38 (5) The ((committee)) department shall issue work permits to
- 39 employers for the employment of minors, after being assured the

- proposed employment of a minor meets the standards ((set forth)) 1 concerning the health, safety and welfare of minors ((as)) set forth in 2 this chapter and the rules ((and regulations promulgated)) adopted by 3 4 the ((committee)) department. No minor person shall be employed in any 5 occupation, trade or industry subject to ((this 1973 amendatory act)) chapter 16, Laws of 1973 2nd ex. sess., unless a work permit has been 6 properly issued((, with)). <u>T</u>he consent of the parent, guardian or 7 8 other person having legal custody of the minor and ((with)) the approval of the school which ((such)) the minor may then be attending 9 10 is also required if a minor age sixteen or seventeen is working more than twenty hours per week during the school year, or if a minor is 11 under age sixteen. 12
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect July 1, 1993.
