HOUSE BILL 1066

- AN ACT Relating to awarding contracts by water or sewer districts;
- 2 and amending RCW 56.08.070 and 57.08.050.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 56.08.070 and 1989 c 105 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) All materials purchased and work ordered, the estimated cost of
- 7 which is in excess of five thousand dollars shall be let by contract.
- 8 All contract projects, the estimated cost of which is less than fifty
- 9 thousand dollars, may be awarded to a contractor on the small works
- 10 roster. The small works roster shall be comprised of all responsible
- 11 contractors who have requested to be on the list. The board of sewer
- 12 commissioners may set up uniform procedures to prequalify contractors
- 13 for inclusion on the small works roster. The board of sewer
- 14 commissioners shall authorize by resolution a procedure for securing
- 15 telephone and/or written quotations from the contractors on the small
- 16 works roster to assure establishment of a competitive price and for
- 17 awarding contracts to the lowest responsible bidder. Such procedure
- 18 shall require that a good faith effort be made to request quotations
- 19 from all contractors on the small works roster. Immediately after an

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award is made, the bid quotations obtained shall be recorded, open to 2 public inspection, and available by telephone inquiry. The small works roster shall be revised once a year. All contract projects equal to or 3 4 in excess of fifty thousand dollars shall be let by competitive 5 bidding. Before awarding any competitive contract the board of sewer commissioners shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper in 6 7 general circulation where the district is located at least once, ten 8 days before the letting of such contract, inviting sealed proposals for 9 such work, plans and specifications which must at the time of publication of such notice be on file in the office of the board of 10 sewer commissioners subject to public inspection. Such notice shall 11 state generally the work to be done and shall call for proposals for 12 doing the same to be sealed and filed with the board of sewer 13 commissioners on or before the day and hour named therein. 14

(2) Each bid shall be accompanied by a bid proposal deposit in the form of a certified check, cashier's check, postal money order, or surety bond payable to the order of the county treasurer for a sum not less than five percent of the amount of the bid and no bid shall be considered unless accompanied by such bid proposal deposit. At the time and place named such bids shall be publicly opened and read and the board of sewer commissioners shall proceed to canvass the bids and may let such contract to the lowest responsible bidder upon plans and specifications: PROVIDED, That no contract shall be let in excess of the cost of ((said)) the materials or work((, or if in the opinion of)). The board of sewer commissioners ((all bids are unsatisfactory they)) may reject all ((of them)) bids for good cause and readvertise and in such case all checks, cash or bid bonds shall be returned to the bidders. If such contract be let, then all checks, cash or bid bonds shall be returned to the bidders, except that of the successful bidder, which shall be retained until a contract shall be entered into for the purchase of such materials or doing such work, and a bond to perform such work furnished with sureties satisfactory to the board of sewer commissioners in the full amount of the contract price between the bidder and the commission in accordance with bid. If ((said)) the bidder fails to enter into ((said)) the contract in accordance with ((said)) the bid and furnish such bond within ten days from the date at which he or she is notified that he or she is the successful bidder, the ((said)) check, cash or bid bonds and the amount thereof shall be forfeited to the sewer district.

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- (3) In the event of an emergency when the public interest or 1 property of the sewer district would suffer material injury or damage 2 by delay, upon resolution of the board of sewer commissioners, or 3 4 proclamation of an official designated by the board to act for the board during such emergencies, declaring the existence of such 5 emergency and reciting the facts constituting the same, the board, or 6 7 the official acting for the board, may waive the requirements of this 8 chapter with reference to any purchase or contract. In addition, these 9 requirements may be waived for purchases which are clearly and 10 legitimately limited to a single source of supply and purchases involving special facilities, services, or market conditions, in which 11 instances the purchase price may be best established by direct 12 13 negotiation.
- 14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 57.08.050 and 1989 c 105 s 2 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- 16 (1) The board of water commissioners shall have authority to create 17 and fill such positions and fix salaries and bonds thereof as it may by 18 resolution provide.
- 19 (2) All materials purchased and work ordered, the estimated cost of which is in excess of five thousand dollars shall be let by contract. 20 All contract projects, the estimated cost of which is less than fifty 21 thousand dollars, may be awarded to a contractor on the small works 22 23 The small works roster shall be comprised of all responsible 24 contractors who have requested to be on the list. The board of water 25 commissioners may set up uniform procedures to prequalify contractors for inclusion on the small works roster. 26 The board of water 27 commissioners shall authorize by resolution a procedure for securing telephone and/or written quotations from the contractors on the small 28 29 works roster to assure establishment of a competitive price and for 30 awarding contracts to the lowest responsible bidder. Such procedure shall require that a good faith effort be made to request quotations 31 from all contractors on the small works roster. Immediately after an 32 33 award is made, the bid quotations obtained shall be recorded, open to 34 public inspection, and available by telephone inquiry. The small works roster shall be revised once a year. All contract projects equal to or 35 36 in excess of fifty thousand dollars shall be let by competitive 37 Before awarding any such contract the board of water 38 commissioners shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper in

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general circulation where the district is located at least once ten days before the letting of such contract, inviting sealed proposals for such work, plans and specifications which must at the time of publication of such notice be on file in the office of the board of water commissioners subject to public inspection. Such notice shall state generally the work to be done and shall call for proposals for doing the same to be sealed and filed with the board of water commissioners on or before the day and hour named therein.

9 (3) Each bid shall be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check 10 or postal money order payable to the order of the county treasurer for a sum not less than five percent of the amount of the bid, or 11 accompanied by a bid bond in an amount not less than five percent of 12 13 the bid with a corporate surety licensed to do business in the state, conditioned that the bidder will pay the district as liquidated damages 14 15 the amount specified in the bond, unless ((he)) the bidder enters into 16 a contract in accordance with his or her bid, and no bid shall be 17 considered unless accompanied by such check, cash or bid bond. At the time and place named such bids shall be publicly opened and read and 18 19 the board of water commissioners shall proceed to canvass the bids and 20 may let such contract to the lowest responsible bidder upon plans and specifications on file or to the best bidder submitting his or her own 21 plans and specifications: PROVIDED, That no contract shall be let in 22 excess of the cost of ((said)) the materials or work((, or if in the 23 24 opinion of)). The board of water commissioners ((all bids are 25 unsatisfactory they)) may reject all ((of them)) bids for good cause 26 and readvertise and in such case all checks, cash or bid bonds shall be returned to the bidders. If such contract be let, then all checks, 27 cash or bid bonds shall be returned to the bidders, except that of the 28 29 successful bidder, which shall be retained until a contract shall be 30 entered into for the purchase of such materials or doing such work, and a bond to perform such work furnished with sureties satisfactory to the 31 board of water commissioners in the full amount of the contract price 32 between the bidder and the commission in accordance with the bid. 33 34 ((said)) the bidder fails to enter into ((said)) the contract in accordance with ((said)) the bid and furnish such bond within ten days 35 from the date at which he or she is notified that he or she is the 36 37 successful bidder, the ((said)) check, cash or bid bonds and the amount thereof shall be forfeited to the water district: PROVIDED, That if 38 39 the bidder fails to enter into a contract in accordance with ((his))

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the bid, and the board of water commissioners deems it necessary to take legal action to collect on any bid bond required herein, then the water district shall be entitled to collect from ((said)) the bidder any legal expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees occasioned thereby.

(4) In the event of an emergency when the public interest or 6 7 property of the water district would suffer material injury or damage 8 by delay, upon resolution of the board of water commissioners, or 9 proclamation of an official designated by the board to act for the board during such emergencies, declaring the existence of such 10 emergency and reciting the facts constituting the same, the board, or 11 official acting for the board, may waive the requirements of this 12 13 chapter with reference to any purchase or contract. In addition, these requirements may be waived for purchases which are clearly and 14 15 legitimately limited to a single source of supply and purchases involving special facilities, services, or market conditions, in which 16 17 instances the purchase price may be best established by direct negotiation. 18

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
