- 1 AN ACT Relating to sales and use taxation of prescription drugs for
- 2 family planning; amending RCW 82.08.0281 and 82.12.0275; creating a new
- 3 section; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that prevention is a
- 6 significant element in the reduction of health care costs. The
- 7 legislature further finds that taxing some physician prescriptions and
- 8 not others is unfair to patients. It is, therefore, the intent of the
- 9 legislature to remove the taxes from prescriptions issued for family
- 10 planning purposes.
- 11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 82.08.0281 and 1980 c 37 s 46 are each amended to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 The tax levied by RCW 82.08.020 shall not apply to sales of
- 14 prescription drugs, including sales to the state or a political
- 15 subdivision or municipal corporation thereof of drugs to be dispensed
- 16 to patients by prescription without charge. The term "prescription
- 17 drugs" shall include any medicine, drug, prescription lens, or other
- 18 substance other than food for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation,

treatment, or prevention of disease or other ailment in humans, or for 1 family planning purposes including the prevention of conception, 2 ordered by (1) the written prescription to a pharmacist by a 3 4 practitioner authorized by law of this state or laws of another jurisdiction to issue prescriptions, or (2) upon an oral prescription 5 of such practitioner which is reduced promptly to writing and filed by 6 a duly licensed pharmacist, or (3) by refilling any such written or 7 8 oral prescription if such refilling is authorized by the prescriber 9 either in the original prescription or by oral order which is reduced 10 promptly to writing and filed by the pharmacist, or (4) physicians or optometrists by way of written directions and specifications for the 11 preparation, grinding, and fabrication of lenses intended to aid or 12 13 correct visual defects or anomalies of humans.

14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 82.12.0275 and 1980 c 37 s 73 are each amended to read 15 as follows:

16 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply in respect to the use of prescription drugs, including the use by the state or a 17 18 political subdivision or municipal corporation thereof of drugs to be 19 dispensed to patients by prescription without charge. The term "prescription drugs" shall include any medicine, drug, prescription 20 lens, or other substance other than food for use in the diagnosis, 21 22 cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease or other ailment 23 in humans, or for family planning purposes including the prevention of 24 conception, ordered by (1) the written prescription to a pharmacist by 25 a practitioner authorized by law of this state or laws of another jurisdiction to issue prescriptions, or (2) upon an oral prescription 26 of such practitioner which is reduced promptly to writing and filed by 27 a duly licensed pharmacist, or (3) by refilling any such written or 28 29 oral prescription if such refilling is authorized by the prescriber either in the original prescription or by oral order which is reduced 30 promptly to writing and filed by the pharmacist, or (4) physicians or 31 optometrists by way of written directions and specifications for the 32 preparation, grinding, and fabrication of lenses intended to aid or 33 34 correct visual defects or anomalies of humans.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** This act is necessary for the immediate 36 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
