- 1 AN ACT Relating to home matching; and adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 43.63A RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 43.63A RCW
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The legislature finds that:
- 7 (a) The trend toward smaller household sizes will continue into the
- 8 foreseeable future;
- 9 (b) Many of these households are in housing units that contain more
- 10 bedrooms than occupants;
- 11 (c) There are older homeowners on relatively low, fixed income who
- 12 are experiencing difficulties maintaining their homes; and
- 13 (d) There are single parents, recently widowed persons, people in
- 14 the midst of divorce or separation, and handicapped that are faced with
- 15 displacement due to the high cost of housing.
- 16 (2) The legislature declares that the purpose of section 2 of this
- 17 act is to develop a pilot program designed to:

- 1 (a) Provide home-matching services that can enable people to 2 continue living in their homes while promoting continuity of home 3 ownership and community stability; and
- 4 (b) Counter the problem of displacement among people on relatively 5 low, fixed incomes by linking people offering living space with people 6 seeking housing.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.63A RCW to read as follows:
- 9 (1) The department may develop and administer a home-matching 10 program for the purpose of providing grants and technical assistance to 11 eligible organizations to operate local home-matching programs. For 12 purposes of this section, "eligible organizations" are those 13 organizations eligible to receive assistance through the Washington 14 housing trust fund, chapter 43.185 RCW.
- 15 (2) The department may select up to five eligible organizations for 16 the purpose of implementing a local home-matching program. 17 home-matching programs are designed to facilitate: 18 Intergenerational homesharing involving older homeowners sharing homes 19 with younger persons; (b) homesharing arrangements that involve an exchange of services such as cooking, housework, gardening, or 20 babysitting for room and board or some financial consideration such as 21 rent; and (c) the more efficient use of available housing. 22
- 23 (3) In selecting local pilot programs under this section, the 24 department shall consider:
- (a) The eligible organization's ability, stability, and resources to implement the local home-matching program;
 - (b) The eligible organization's efforts to coordinate other support services needed by the individual or family participating in the local home-matching program; and
 - (c) Other factors the department deems appropriate.
- 31 (4) The eligible organizations shall establish criteria for 32 participation in the local home-matching program. The eligible 33 organization shall make a determination of eligibility regarding the 34 individuals' or families' participation in the local home-matching 35 program. The determination shall include, but is not limited to a 36 verification of the individual's or family's history of making rent 37 payments in a consistent and timely manner.
