- 1 AN ACT Relating to American Indians; and adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 28B.10 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A center is established for the development
- 5 of curriculum on American Indians of the Northwest. The center shall
- 6 be administered by a state institution of higher education selected by
- 7 the higher education coordinating board. In making its selection, the
- 8 board shall have the following powers and duties:
- 9 (1) To appoint an advisory committee to assist the board in the
- 10 design of the request for proposal and the selection of the
- 11 administering institution;
- 12 (2) Through a competitive process that gives priority to proposals
- 13 that are collaborative and are sensitive to the needs of teachers and
- 14 of members of the American Indian community, to select a lead
- 15 institution to administer the center; and
- 16 (3) To consider institutional roles and missions and plans for
- 17 areas of emphasis or excellence when selecting an institution to
- 18 administer the center.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The purposes of the center established in section 1 of this act shall include but not be limited to:
- 3 (1) Developing and disseminating curriculum for students in the K-4 12 system on the culture, history, government, and philosophy of 5 American Indians;
- 6 (2) When funding is available, assisting school districts to 7 evaluate textbooks and course materials to ensure that the perspective 8 of American Indians is included in subject matter on the history, 9 culture, government, psychology, and philosophy of the people of this 10 country, state, and region;
- 11 (3) Working with Washington's colleges and universities to develop 12 course work and materials for prospective teachers on the culture, 13 history, philosophy, psychology, and government of the American Indian 14 peoples of the Pacific Northwest;
- 15 (4) Providing materials, institutes, and workshops on American 16 Indians to teachers, college and university professors, and school 17 administrators;
- 18 (5) Working with American Indians, Indian educators, school 19 administrators, parents, and community leaders to ensure that issues of 20 concern to American Indians remain a major focal point of the center; 21 and
- 22 (6) Seeking additional funding from federal, local, and private 23 sources.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The president of the lead institution or his or her designee shall appoint a committee to advise the center created in section 1 of this act. The committee shall include, but need not be limited to representatives of: The governor's office of Indian affairs, the Indian educators association, the office of the superintendent of public instruction, teachers, professors in schools or colleges of education, and members of Washington's Indian tribes.
- 31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Sections 1 through 3 of this act are each 32 added to chapter 28B.10 RCW.
