- 1 AN ACT Relating to revoking drivers' licenses; and amending RCW
- 2 46.20.285.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.20.285 and 1990 c 250 s 43 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 The department shall forthwith revoke the license of any driver for
- 7 the period of one calendar year unless otherwise provided in this
- 8 section, upon receiving a record of the driver's conviction of any of
- 9 the following offenses, when the conviction has become final:
- 10 (1) For vehicular homicide the period of revocation shall be two 11 years;
- 12 (2) Vehicular assault;
- 13 (3) Driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of
- 14 intoxicating liquor or a narcotic drug, or under the influence of any
- 15 other drug to a degree which renders the driver incapable of safely
- 16 driving a motor vehicle, upon a showing by the department's records
- 17 that the conviction is the second such conviction for the driver within
- 18 a period of five years. Upon a showing that the conviction is the

- third such conviction for the driver within a period of five years, the
 period of revocation shall be two years;
- 3 (4) Any felony in the commission of which a motor vehicle ((is 4 used)) serves an integral function;
- 5 (5) Failure to stop and give information or render aid as required 6 under the laws of this state in the event of a motor vehicle accident 7 resulting in the death or personal injury of another or resulting in 8 damage to a vehicle that is driven or attended by another;
- 9 (6) Perjury or the making of a false affidavit or statement under 10 oath to the department under Title 46 RCW or under any other law 11 relating to the ownership or operation of motor vehicles;
- 12 (7) Reckless driving upon a showing by the department's records 13 that the conviction is the third such conviction for the driver within 14 a period of two years.
