- 1 AN ACT Relating to liability for furnishing liquor to minors;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 4.24 RCW; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 4.24 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- (1) An adult who furnishes intoxicating liquor to a minor is liable for economic damages to persons or property caused by the minor's consumption. This section applies to furnishing alcohol under any
- 9 circumstances whether commercially, socially, or otherwise.
- 10 (2) As used in this section:
- 11 (a) "Minor" means a person under the age of twenty-one years.
- 12 (b) "Adult" means a person over the age of seventeen years.
- 13 (c) "Economic damages" means objectively verifiable monetary
- 14 losses, including medical expenses, loss of earnings, burial costs,
- 15 loss of use of property, cost of replacement or repair, cost of
- 16 obtaining substitute domestic services, loss of employment, and loss of
- 17 business or employment opportunities.

- 1 (3) This section is in addition to and does not abridge or alter 2 alternative rights of action that may be available under statutes, 3 ordinances, regulations, or at common law.
- 4 (4) No person who has complied with the provisions of RCW 66.20.210 5 is liable under this section.
