
ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1409

- 1 AN ACT Relating to health treatment for individuals with
- 2 developmental disabilities; amending RCW 71A.10.020 and 18.88A.020;
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 71A.10 RCW; adding a new section to
- 4 chapter 18.88A RCW; and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 71A.10 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (1) In order to enhance the independence and to protect the health
- 9 and safety of people with developmental disabilities, community
- 10 residential programs certified by the department of social and health
- 11 services under chapter 71A.12 RCW and adult family homes licensed under
- 12 chapter 70.128 RCW and also certified by the department of social and
- 13 health services under chapter 71A.12 RCW may permit certain staff who
- 14 are employed as direct care staff who have been trained and have
- 15 registered as a nursing assistant-registered, providing services to
- 16 persons with developmental disabilities as defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5)
- 17 to administer the following medications or treatments to persons with
- 18 developmental disabilities:
- 19 (a) Oral medication;

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- 1 (b) Topical medication;
- 2 (c) Nose, ear, and eye drops;
- 3 (d) Suppositories;

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- 4 (e) Home glucose testing and monitoring procedures if the 5 glucometer is recalibrated daily;
 - (f) Enemas packaged in unit doses only;
- 7 (g) Prescribed emergency procedures, which shall be limited to 8 activating emergency services, specifically, calling 911 and notifying 9 the attending physician and/or the supervising nurse; and
- 10 (h) Gastrostomy tube feedings, under conditions provided in 11 subsection (4) of this section.
- 12 (2) Treatment authorized by this section must be prescribed by a 13 health care practitioner licensed under Title 18 RCW and who has 14 prescriptive authority, acting within the scope of his or her license, 15 and may be administered only after proper training as specified in 16 subsection (3) of this section.
- 17 (3) The nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) shall receive the training specified in this subsection. The person conducting the training must be a registered nurse licensed under chapter 18.88 RCW. A registered nurse shall not be subject to any reprisal or disciplinary action for refusing to provide the training required under this section. Training shall include the following:
- (a) Teaching of the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) the task, including the nature of the condition requiring treatment, risks of the treatment, side effects, and interaction of prescribed medications;
- (b) Observation of the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) performing the task to assure that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) does the task safely and accurately;
- 30 (c) Written instructions for performance of the task for the 31 nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) to use as a reference;
- (d) Instructions to the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) that the task being taught is specific to this client only and is not transferable to other clients or taught to other care providers;
- (e) Documentation of how the task was taught, the teaching outcome, the content and type of instructions left for the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5), evidence that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) understands risks involved in performing

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- the task and has a plan for how to respond to the consequences, and evidence that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) was instructed that the task is client-specific and not transferable to other clients or providers;
- 5 (f) Performance of the administration of medications or treatments 6 by nursing assistants defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) authorized in this 7 section shall be reviewed at least annually by a registered nurse.
- 8 (4) A registered nurse may delegate administration of gastrostomy, 9 but not nasogastric, tube feedings to a nursing assistant defined in 10 RCW 18.88A.020(5) specific to one client under the following 11 conditions:
- 12 (a) The registered nurse shall consider the nature of the task to 13 be provided, its complexity, risk involved, and the necessary skill 14 needed;
- 15 (b) The registered nurse shall assess the client's condition and 16 determine that there is not a significant risk to the client if the 17 nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) performs the task in the 18 absence of direct supervision;
- 19 (c) The registered nurse shall determine how frequently the 20 client's condition shall be reassessed to determine the appropriateness 21 of the continued delegation of the task to a nursing assistant defined 22 in RCW 18.88A.020(5);
- 23 (d) If there is some risk involved to the client, the registered 24 nurse shall determine that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 25 18.88A.020(5) is prepared to respond effectively to the consequences;
- (e) The registered nurse shall assess the ability of the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) to perform the task;
- 28 (f) The registered nurse shall determine the frequency of 29 supervision of the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5);
- 30 (g) The registered nurse shall document the process for deciding 31 that the task can be safely delegated for the specific client to the 32 specific nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5);
- 33 (h) The registered nurse shall document how frequently the client 34 should be reassessed by a registered nurse regarding continued 35 delegation of the task to the nursing assistant defined in RCW 36 18.88A.020(5);
- 37 (i) The responsibility, accountability, and authority of the 38 registered nurse shall be limited to teaching and delegation of 39 administration of gastrostomy tube feeding to the nursing assistant

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- 1 defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5), and the determination of which nursing
- 2 assistants defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) and the number of nursing
- 3 assistants defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) that must be taught and
- 4 delegated the task of administration of gastrostomy tube feedings shall
- 5 remain with the registered nurse;
- 6 (j) The number of persons to whom the tasks are taught and 7 delegated shall be limited to the number that can be safely supervised 8 by the registered nurse; and
- 9 (k) The registered nurse shall assure that the nursing assistant 10 defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) maintains proficiency in performing the 11 tasks through periodic supervision, and reviews conducted at least 12 annually, by the registered nurse.
- (5) The delegating registered nurse has a responsibility to 13 determine that the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) is 14 15 indeed competent to perform the delegated act. Nonnursing and 16 managerial persons shall not coerce the registered nurse into compromising client safety by requiring the registered nurse to 17 Both the delegating registered nurse and the nursing 18 19 assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) are accountable for their own 20 actions in the delegation process.
- (6) Verification of the current registration of a person holding himself or herself out to be a nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5) and any restrictions relating to the registration shall be the responsibility of the employer of the nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020(5).
- (7) Development of rules implementing subsections (2), (3), (4), and (5) of this section shall be jointly adopted by the department of social and health services and the Washington state board of nursing.
 - (8) A basic core training curriculum on providing care in residential settings for people with developmental disabilities shall be in addition to the specific nursing assistant training specified in this section. Such additional training shall be developed and adopted by rule by the secretary of the department of social and health services.
- 35 (9) This section may not be construed to apply to persons who are 36 not developmentally disabled or to persons who are living in 37 residential habilitation centers, nor to any setting or facility other 38 than community residential programs certified by the department of 39 social and health services under chapter 71A.12 RCW and adult family

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- 1 homes licensed under chapter 70.128 RCW and also certified by the
- 2 department of social and health services under chapter 71A.12 RCW.
- 3 **Sec. 2.** RCW 71A.10.020 and 1988 c 176 s 102 are each amended to 4 read as follows:
- 5 As used in this title, the following terms have the meanings 6 indicated unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 7 (1) "Department" means the department of social and health 8 services.
- 9 (2) "Developmental disability" means a disability attributable to mental retardation, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism, or another 10 neurological or other condition of an individual found by the secretary 11 to be closely related to mental retardation or to require treatment 12 13 similar to that required for individuals with mental retardation, which 14 disability originates before the individual attains age eighteen, which 15 has continued or can be expected to continue indefinitely, and which 16 constitutes a substantial handicap to the individual. By January 1, 1989, the department shall promulgate rules which define neurological 17 18 or other conditions in a way that is not limited to intelligence quotient scores as the sole ((determinate [determinant])) determinant 19 of these conditions, and notify the legislature of this action. 20
- 21 (3) "Eligible person" means a person who has been found by the 22 secretary under RCW 71A.16.040 to be eligible for services.
- 23 (4) "Habilitative services" means those services provided by 24 program personnel to assist persons in acquiring and maintaining life 25 skills and to raise their levels of physical, mental, social, and 26 vocational functioning. Habilitative services include education, 27 training for employment, and therapy.

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- (5) "Legal representative" means a parent of a person who is under eighteen years of age, a person's legal guardian, a person's limited guardian when the subject matter is within the scope of the limited guardianship, a person's attorney at law, a person's attorney in fact, or any other person who is authorized by law to act for another person.
- 33 (6) "Notice" or "notification" of an action of the secretary means 34 notice in compliance with RCW 71A.10.060.
- 35 (7) "Residential habilitation center" means a state-operated 36 facility for persons with developmental disabilities governed by 37 chapter 71A.20 RCW.

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- 1 (8) "Secretary" means the secretary of social and health services 2 or the secretary's designee.
- 3 (9) "Service" or "services" means services provided by state or 4 local government to carry out this title.
- 5 (10) "Delegation" means direct authorization granted by a 6 registered nurse to an unlicensed nursing assistant defined in RCW 7 18.88A.020(5) to perform the functions authorized in this chapter that 8 fall within the scope of practice of the delegator and that are not 9 within the scope of practice of the delegatee.
- (11) "Supervision of nursing assistant defined in RCW 18.88A.020" 10 means the provision of quidance and evaluation by a qualified 11 registered nurse for the accomplishment of the specific tasks 12 enumerated in section 1 of this act with the initial direction of the 13 14 task or activity, periodic inspection of the actual act of accomplishing the task or activity, and the authority to require 15 corrective action. The licensed registered nurse is not required to be 16 on the premises but has given oral and written instructions relating to 17 the specific task or activity and the client has been assessed by the 18 19 licensed registered nurse prior to authority or delegation being granted to perform the task or activity. 20
- 21 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.88A.020 and 1991 c 16 s 2 are each amended to read 22 as follows:
- Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter.
 - (1) "Department" means the department of health.
- 26 (2) "Secretary" means the secretary of health.
- 27 (3) "Board" means the Washington state board of nursing.
- 28 (4) "Nursing assistant" means an individual, regardless of title, 29 who, under the direction and supervision of a registered nurse or
- 30 licensed practical nurse, assists in the delivery of nursing and
- 31 nursing-related activities to patients in a health care facility. The
- 32 two levels of nursing assistants are (a) "nursing assistant-certified,"
- 33 an individual certified under this chapter, (b) "nursing assistant-
- 34 registered, " an individual registered under this chapter.
- 35 (5) "Nursing assistant-registered, providing services to persons
- 36 <u>with developmental disabilities" means an individual employed as direct</u>
- 37 care staff in a community residential program certified by the
- 38 department of social and health services under chapter 71A.12 RCW or an

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- 1 adult family home licensed under chapter 70.128 RCW and who has been
- 2 trained by a registered nurse licensed under chapter 18.88 RCW to
- 3 administer the specific medications or treatments authorized in section
- 4 1 of this act.
- 5 <u>(6)</u> "Committee" means the Washington state nursing assistant 6 advisory committee.
- 7 (((6))) (7) "Approved training program" means a nursing assistant-
- 8 certified training program approved by the board. For community
- 9 college, vocational-technical institutes, skill centers, and secondary
- 10 school as defined in chapter 28B.50 RCW, nursing assistant-certified
- 11 training programs shall be approved by the board in cooperation with
- 12 the board for community <u>and technical</u> college<u>s</u> ((education)) or the
- 13 superintendent of public instruction.
- 14 $((\frac{7}{}))$ (8) "Health care facility" means a nursing home, hospital,
- 15 hospice care facility, home health care agency, hospice agency, or
- 16 other entity for delivery of health care services as defined by the
- 17 board.
- 18 $((\frac{8}{1}))$ <u>(9)</u> "Competency evaluation" means the measurement of an
- 19 individual's knowledge and skills as related to safe, competent
- 20 performance as a nursing assistant.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 18.88A RCW
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 For the purposes of maintaining a registry of qualified persons and
- 24 becoming subject to the provisions of chapter 18.130 RCW, an unlicensed
- 25 person authorized to administer medications or treatments under section
- 26 1 of this act shall register with the Washington state board of nursing
- 27 as a nursing assistant-registered, providing services to persons with
- 28 developmental disabilities.
- 29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** The secretary of health in consultation with
- 30 the state board of nursing and the department of social and health
- 31 services shall monitor the implementation of this act and shall make an
- 32 interim report by December 31, 1995, and a final report by December 31,
- 33 1996, to the legislature on the effectiveness of this act, including
- 34 whether registration provides sufficient safeguards for protecting the
- 35 health and safety of persons with developmental disabilities, and with
- 36 any recommendations for improvements. The report shall be based on
- 37 direct observation, documentation, and interviews, and shall

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- 1 specifically include a recommendation on whether a change in the level
- 2 of credentialing is appropriate relating to patient care and safety.

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
