- 1 AN ACT Relating to residential underground heating oil tanks;
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 19.27 RCW; adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 18.85 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 80.04 RCW; providing
- 4 an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 19.27 RCW
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 The provisions of the uniform fire code governing the abandonment
- 9 of underground storage tanks shall apply to underground storage tanks
- 10 used to store fuel oil and connected to oil-burning equipment.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 19.27 RCW
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (1) The department of ecology, in consultation with the council and
- 14 representatives from fire protection agencies, industry, and the
- 15 public, shall establish standards for the proper abandonment of
- 16 residential underground heating oil storage tanks.
- 17 (2) The local government building official shall not issue a final
- 18 permit approving construction involving the conversion of a fuel-oil

- 1 heating system to another source of fuel unless the building official
- 2 determines that any underground storage tank connected to the fuel oil
- 3 heating system has been abandoned in conformance with this chapter and
- 4 any rules adopted by the council under this chapter and the standards
- 5 adopted by the department of ecology pursuant to subsection (1) of this
- 6 section.
- 7 (3) The department of ecology, in consultation with the utilities
- 8 and transportation commission, the council, energy utilities, the oil
- 9 heat industry, and local government, shall develop and disseminate
- 10 materials to the public describing the standards and procedures for
- 11 properly abandoning underground residential heating oil tanks.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 18.85 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 At the time written disclosure is given to a potential purchaser of
- 15 residential real property, the seller or the seller's agent shall
- 16 disclose the presence of any underground residential heating oil tanks
- 17 of which the seller or the seller's agent knows or reasonably should
- 18 have knowledge. The disclosure shall include any underground tanks
- 19 that have been abandoned in place and a brief description of the
- 20 procedures used to abandon those tanks.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 80.04 RCW
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 The commission shall adopt rules requiring electric and gas
- 24 companies to advise their customers at least once each year of the
- 25 availability of the public education materials developed under section
- 26 2 of this act.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** If any provision of this act or its
- 28 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 29 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 30 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 32 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

- 1 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 2 effect July 1, 1993.
