risk assessments, risk management, and recommendations.

The marine operating fund is hereby created in the state treasury. 1 This fund is the continuation of the fund established by section 39, 2 3 chapter 15, Laws of 1991, special session. The department shall 4 transfer operating subsidies from the Puget Sound ferry operations account and the ferry user revenues from the ferry system revolving 5 account to the marine operating fund. The department shall transfer 6 moneys from the ferry system revolving account to the marine operating 7 8 fund so as to minimize the need for revenues from the Puget Sound ferry 9 operations account during June of each respective fiscal year in 10 support of the expenditures necessary for the operation and maintenance 11 of the state ferry system.

The appropriations of moneys and the 12 NEW SECTION. Sec. 69. 13 designation of funds and accounts by this and other acts of the 1993 14 legislature shall be construed in a manner consistent with legislation enacted by the 1985, 1987, 1989, and 1991 legislatures to conform state 15 16 funds and accounts with generally accepted accounting principles. any provision of this act or its application to any person or 17 18 circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the act or the 19 application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected. 20

NEW SECTION. Sec. 70. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
