- 1 AN ACT Relating to the instruction in Braille reading and writing
- 2 to blind students; and adding new sections to chapter 28A.155 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. Unless the context clearly requires
- 5 otherwise, the definitions in this section apply throughout sections 2
- 6 through 4 of this act.
- 7 (1) "Legally blind" means:
- 8 (a) Having a visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye with
- 9 conventional correction or having a limited field of vision such that
- 10 the widest diameter of the visual field subtends an angular distance
- 11 not greater than twenty degrees;
- 12 (b) Having a physical condition with a medical expectation of
- 13 visual deterioration; or
- 14 (c) Being unable to read printed material at a competitive rate
- 15 with facility due to lack of visual acuity or other visual impairment.
- 16 (2) "Braille" means the system of reading and writing through touch
- 17 commonly known as standard English Braille.
- 18 (3) "Student" means any student who is legally blind or any student
- 19 eligible for special education services for the visually impaired as

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- 1 defined in the individuals with disabilities education act, 20 U.S.C.
- 2 Sec. 1400 et seq.
- 3 (4) "Superintendent" means the superintendent of public
- 4 instruction.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Students may receive instruction in Braille
- 6 reading and writing as part of their individualized education program.
- 7 In the development of this program, there shall be a presumption that
- 8 proficiency in Braille reading and writing is essential for
- 9 satisfactory educational progress. No student may be denied the
- 10 opportunity for instruction in Braille reading and writing solely
- 11 because the student has some remaining vision.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Instruction in Braille reading and writing
- 13 shall be sufficient to enable each student to communicate effectively
- 14 and efficiently at a level commensurate with such student's sighted
- 15 peers of comparable grade level and intellect. The individualized
- 16 education program shall specify:
- 17 (1) How Braille will be implemented as the primary mode for
- 18 learning through integration with normal classroom activities. If
- 19 Braille will not be provided to a child who is legally blind, the
- 20 reason for not incorporating it in the individualized education program
- 21 shall be documented;
- 22 (2) The date on which Braille instruction will commence;
- 23 (3) The level of competency in Braille reading and writing to be
- 24 achieved by the end of the period covered by the individualized
- 25 education program; and
- 26 (4) The duration of each session of Braille instruction.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The superintendent shall require that
- 28 special education teachers responsible for the education of legally
- 29 blind and visually impaired children demonstrate competency in reading
- 30 and writing Braille. The superintendent shall adopt procedures to
- 31 assess such competency that are consistent with the standards adopted
- 32 by the national library service for the blind and physically
- 33 handicapped.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Sections 1 through 4 of this act are each added to chapter 28A.155 RCW.
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
