- 1 AN ACT Relating to abandoned, unauthorized, or junk vehicles;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 46.55 RCW; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 46.55 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) The abandonment of any vehicle creates a prima facie 7 presumption that the last registered owner of record is responsible for 8 the abandonment and is liable for costs incurred in removing, storing, 9 and disposing of the abandoned vehicle less amounts realized at
- 9 and disposing of the abandoned vehicle, less amounts realized at
- 10 auction.
- 11 (2) If an unauthorized vehicle is found abandoned under subsection
- 12 (1) of this section, the last registered owner of record is guilty of
- 13 a traffic infraction under chapter 46.63 RCW, unless the vehicle is
- 14 redeemed after impound as provided in RCW 46.55.120. In addition to
- 15 the monetary penalty payable under that chapter, the person found to
- 16 have committed the infraction is also liable for a deficiency remaining
- 17 after disposal of the vehicle under RCW 46.55.140.
- 18 (3) Filing a report of sale or transfer regarding the vehicle
- 19 involved in accordance with RCW 46.12.101(1) or a vehicle theft report

- 1 filed with a law enforcement agency relieves the last registered owner 2 of liability under subsections (1) and (2) of this section.
- 3 (4) For the purposes of RCW 46.63.070(5)(b), a traffic infraction 4 under subsection (2) of this section is a moving violation and is not 5 considered to be a standing, stopping, or parking violation.
