- AN ACT Relating to the organization of the liquor control board; amending RCW 66.04.010, 66.08.012, 66.08.014, 66.08.020, 66.08.030, 66.08.050, 66.08.150, 10.93.020, 19.02.050, 43.03.028, 43.17.010, 43.17.020, 42.17.2401, and 43.82.010; adding new sections to chapter 5 66.08 RCW; creating new sections; repealing RCW 66.08.016; and 6 providing an effective date.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 8 **Sec. 1.** RCW 66.04.010 and 1991 c 192 s 1 are each amended to read 9 as follows:
- 10 In this title, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 11 (1) <u>"Agency" means the liquor control agency, the state agency</u>
 12 <u>established under section 2 of this act.</u>
- (2) "Alcohol" is that substance known as ethyl alcohol, hydrated oxide of ethyl, or spirit of wine, which is commonly produced by the fermentation or distillation of grain, starch, molasses, or sugar, or other substances including all dilutions and mixtures of this substance. The term "alcohol" does not include alcohol in the possession of a manufacturer or distiller of alcohol fuel, as described in RCW 66.12.130, which is intended to be denatured and used as a fuel

- 3 $((\frac{(2)}{2}))$ "Beer" means any malt beverage or malt liquor as these 4 terms are defined in this chapter.
- 5 (((3))) (4) "Brewer" means any person engaged in the business of 6 manufacturing beer and malt liquor.
- 7 ((\(\frac{(4)}{1}\)) (5) "Board" means the liquor control board, the rule-making 8 and quasi-judicial body constituted under this title.
- 9 (((5))) <u>(6)</u> "Club" means an organization of persons, incorporated 10 or unincorporated, operated solely for fraternal, benevolent, 11 educational, athletic or social purposes, and not for pecuniary gain.
- 12 (((+6+))) (7) "Consume" includes the putting of liquor to any use, 13 whether by drinking or otherwise.
- $((\frac{7}{}))$ (8) "Dentist" means a practitioner of dentistry duly and regularly licensed and engaged in the practice of his <u>or her</u> profession within the state pursuant to chapter 18.32 RCW.
- 17 (((8))) <u>(9) "Director" means the director of the liquor control</u>
 18 <u>agency.</u>
- 19 $\underline{(10)}$ "Distiller" means a person engaged in the business of 20 distilling spirits.
- ((+9))) (11) "Druggist" means any person who holds a valid certificate and is a registered pharmacist and is duly and regularly engaged in carrying on the business of pharmaceutical chemistry pursuant to chapter 18.64 RCW.
- (((10))) <u>(12)</u> "Drug store" means a place whose principal business is, the sale of drugs, medicines and pharmaceutical preparations and maintains a regular prescription department and employs a registered pharmacist during all hours the drug store is open.
- 29 (((11))) <u>(13)</u> "Employee" means any person employed by the ((board)) 30 <u>director</u>, including a vendor, as hereinafter in this section defined.
- 31 $((\frac{12}{12}))$ <u>(14)</u> "Fund" means 'liquor revolving fund.'
- $((\frac{13}{13}))$ <u>(15)</u> "Hotel" means every building or other structure kept, 32 33 used, maintained, advertised or held out to the public to be a place 34 where food is served and sleeping accommodations are offered for pay to 35 transient quests, in which twenty or more rooms are used for the sleeping accommodation of such transient guests and having one or more 36 37 dining rooms where meals are served to such transient guests, such sleeping accommodations and dining rooms being conducted in the same 38 building and buildings, in connection therewith, and such structure or 39

structures being provided, in the judgment of the board, with adequate and sanitary kitchen and dining room equipment and capacity, for preparing, cooking and serving suitable food for its guests: PROVIDED FURTHER, That in cities and towns of less than five thousand population, the board shall have authority to waive the provisions requiring twenty or more rooms.

7 $((\frac{14}{14}))$ (16) "Imprisonment" means confinement in the county jail. 8 $((\frac{15}{15}))$ <u>(17)</u> "Liquor" includes the four varieties of liquor herein 9 defined (alcohol, spirits, wine and beer), and all fermented, spirituous, vinous, or malt liquor, or combinations thereof, and mixed 10 liquor, a part of which is fermented, spirituous, vinous or malt 11 liquor, or otherwise intoxicating; and every liquid or solid or 12 semisolid or other substance, patented or not, containing alcohol, 13 spirits, wine or beer, and all drinks or drinkable liquids and all 14 15 preparations or mixtures capable of human consumption, and any liquid, semisolid, solid, or other substance, which contains more than one 16 percent of alcohol by weight shall be conclusively deemed to be 17 intoxicating. Liquor does not include confections or food products 18 19 that contain one percent or less of alcohol by weight.

20 $((\frac{16}{16}))$ <u>(18)</u> "Manufacturer" means a person engaged in the 21 preparation of liquor for sale, in any form whatsoever.

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(((17))) (19) "Malt beverage" or "malt liquor" means any beverage
such as beer, ale, lager beer, stout, and porter obtained by the
alcoholic fermentation of an infusion or decoction of pure hops, or
pure extract of hops and pure barley malt or other wholesome grain or
cereal in pure water containing not more than eight percent of alcohol
by weight, and not less than one-half of one percent of alcohol by
volume. For the purposes of this title, any such beverage containing
more than eight percent of alcohol by weight shall be referred to as
"strong beer."

31 (((18))) (20) "Package" means any container or receptacle used for 32 holding liquor.

 $((\frac{19}{19}))$ (21) "Permit" means a permit for the purchase of liquor 34 under this title.

35 $((\frac{(20)}{)})$ <u>(22)</u> "Person" means an individual, copartnership, 36 association, or corporation.

 $((\frac{(21)}{)})$ (23) "Physician" means a medical practitioner duly and regularly licensed and engaged in the practice of his <u>or her</u> profession within the state pursuant to chapter 18.71 RCW.

 $((\frac{22}{2}))$ (24) "Prescription" means a memorandum signed by a 2 physician and given by him <u>or her</u> to a patient for the obtaining of 3 liquor pursuant to this title for medicinal purposes.

 $((\frac{(23)}{25}))$ "Public place" includes streets and alleys of incorporated cities and towns; state or county or township highways or roads; buildings and grounds used for school purposes; public dance halls and grounds adjacent thereto; those parts of establishments where beer may be sold under this title, soft drink establishments, public buildings, public meeting halls, lobbies, halls and dining rooms of hotels, restaurants, theatres, stores, garages and filling stations which are open to and are generally used by the public and to which the public is permitted to have unrestricted access; railroad trains, stages, and other public conveyances of all kinds and character, and the depots and waiting rooms used in conjunction therewith which are open to unrestricted use and access by the public; publicly owned bathing beaches, parks, and/or playgrounds; and all other places of like or similar nature to which the general public has unrestricted right of access, and which are generally used by the public.

(((24))) <u>(26)</u> "Regulations" <u>or "rules"</u> means ((regulations made))
rules adopted under chapter 34.05 RCW by the board under the powers
conferred by this title.

 $((\frac{25}{25}))$ (27) "Restaurant" means any establishment provided with special space and accommodations where, in consideration of payment, food, without lodgings, is habitually furnished to the public, not including drug stores and soda fountains.

((\(\frac{26}\))) (28) "Sale" and "sell" include exchange, barter, and traffic; and also include the selling or supplying or distributing, by any means whatsoever, of liquor, or of any liquid known or described as beer or by any name whatever commonly used to describe malt or brewed liquor or of wine, by any person to any person; and also include a sale or selling within the state to a foreign consignee or his or her agent in the state. "Sale" and "sell" shall not include the giving, at no charge, of a reasonable amount of liquor by a person not licensed by the ((board)) agency to a person not licensed by the ((board)) agency, for personal use only. "Sale" and "sell" also does not include a raffle authorized under RCW 9.46.0315: PROVIDED, That the nonprofit organization conducting the raffle has obtained the appropriate permit from the ((board)) agency.

- (((34))) (36) "Wine" means any alcoholic beverage obtained by fermentation of fruits (grapes, berries, apples, et cetera) or other agricultural product containing sugar, to which any saccharine substances may have been added before, during or after fermentation, and containing not more than twenty-four percent of alcohol by volume, including sweet wines fortified with wine spirits, such as port, sherry, muscatel and angelica, not exceeding twenty-four percent of alcohol by volume and not less than one-half of one percent of alcohol by volume. For purposes of this title, any beverage containing no more than fourteen percent of alcohol by volume when bottled or packaged by the manufacturer shall be referred to as "table wine," and any beverage containing alcohol in an amount more than fourteen percent by volume when bottled or packaged by the manufacturer shall be referred to as "fortified wine." However, "fortified wine" shall not include: (a) Wines that are both sealed or capped by cork closure and aged two years or more; and (b) wines that contain more than fourteen percent alcohol by volume solely as a result of the natural fermentation process and that have not been produced with the addition of wine spirits, brandy,
- This subsection shall not be interpreted to require that any wine be labeled with the designation "table wine" or "fortified wine."

- 23 take place January 1, 1994. This act does not create a new agency, but
- 24 renames the Washington State liquor control board and provides for a
- 25 new administrative structure within the renamed agency.

- 27 as follows:
- 28 There shall be a board, known as the "Washington state liquor
- 29 control board, consisting of three members, to be appointed by the
- 30 governor, with the consent of the senate, who shall each be ((paid an
- 31 annual salary to be fixed by the governor in accordance with the
- 32 provisions of RCW 43.03.040)) compensated in accordance with RCW
- 33 43.03.250 and shall be reimbursed for subsistence and mileage in
- 34 accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060. The governor may, in his
- 35 or her discretion, appoint one of the members as ((chairman)) chair of
- 36 the board, and a majority of the members shall constitute a quorum of

- 1 the board. The board shall meet once a month or at such times as the
- 2 chair may designate.
- 3 **Sec. 5.** RCW 66.08.014 and 1986 c 105 s 1 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
- 5 (1) The members of the board to be appointed after December 2, 1948, shall be appointed for terms beginning January 15, 1949, and 6 7 expiring as follows: One member of the board for a term of three years from January 15, 1949; one member of the board for a term of six years 8 9 from January 15, 1949; and one member of the board for a term of nine years from January 15, 1949. Each of the members of the board 10 appointed hereunder shall hold office until his or her successor is 11 12 appointed and qualified. After June 11, 1986, the term that began on January 15, 1985, will end on January 15, 1989, the term beginning on 13 14 January 15, 1988, will end on January 15, 1993, and the term beginning 15 on January 15, 1991, will end on January 15, 1997. Thereafter, upon 16 the expiration of the term of any member appointed after June 11, 1986, each succeeding member of the board shall be appointed and hold office 17 18 for the term of six years. - 29 (3) Any member of the board may be removed for inefficiency, 30 malfeasance or misfeasance in office, upon specific written charges filed by the governor, who shall transmit such written charges to the 31 member accused and to the chief justice of the supreme court. 32 33 chief justice shall thereupon designate a tribunal composed of three 34 judges of the superior court to hear and adjudicate the charges. Such tribunal shall fix the time of the hearing, which shall be public, and 35 36 the procedure for the hearing, and the decision of such tribunal shall be final and not subject to review by the supreme court. Before entering upon the duties of his 5 or her office, each of ((said)) the members of the board shall enter 6 7 into a surety bond executed by a surety company authorized to do 8 business in this state, payable to the state of Washington, to be 9 approved by the governor in the penal sum of fifty thousand dollars 10 conditioned upon the faithful performance of his or her duties, and shall take and subscribe to the oath of office prescribed for elective 11 state officers, which oath and bond shall be filed with the secretary 12 13 The premium for ((said)) the bond shall be paid by the of state. - The administration of this title, including the general control, management, and supervision of all liquor stores, shall be vested in the ((liquor control board, constituted under this title.)) director, who shall carry out this administrative function in accordance with the rules adopted by the board.
- In addition to any other powers granted or transferred to the director, the director shall have the following powers and duties as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this title:
- 25 (1) Supervise and administer the operations of the liquor control 26 agency in accordance with the provisions of this title;
 - (2) Appoint personnel and prescribe their duties;

all of the employees of the ((board)) liquor control agency: PROVIDED,
That the premiums therefor shall be paid by the ((board)) agency;

- 3 The board, subject to the provisions of this title and the 4 regulations, shall:
