- 1 AN ACT Relating to skill centers; and adding a new chapter to Title
- 2 28C RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** As retraining becomes a common part of adult
- 5 work life, it is important that all vocational education opportunities
- 6 be used to the maximum extent possible. Skill centers established to
- 7 provide vocational training for high school students are used during
- 8 the morning and early afternoon. These facilities are idle during the
- 9 late afternoon and evening hours. At the same time, community colleges
- 10 have more students applying than they can accommodate. To assure that
- 11 we meet the needs of our citizens in seeking training or retraining,
- 12 all vocational training facilities should be used to the maximum extent
- 13 possible.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** High school age students who have completed
- 15 a regular high school program during the regularly offered high school
- 16 class time and adults shall be allowed to enroll in skill centers in
- 17 the late afternoon and early evening. Adults may attend day classes on
- 18 a space available basis. Priority in enrollment shall be given to high

- 1 school students. Once an adult is enrolled in a skill center program
- 2 he or she shall not be displaced by another student.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The community colleges shall act as agents
- 4 for the skill centers in the enrollment of adults. Enrollment of the
- 5 adult students shall not count toward the community college enrollment
- 6 lid.
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. High school students who are enrolled in the
- 8 skill center program in excess of the normal program hour offerings
- 9 required in RCW 28A.150.220 shall pay tuition to the skill center to
- 10 cover the full cost of the program in which they are enrolled. Adults
- 11 enrolled in skill center programs shall pay tuition to cover the full
- 12 cost of the program in which they are enrolled plus a five percent
- 13 management fee to the community college. The community college shall
- 14 then transfer the tuition payment to the skill center.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Any state institution of higher education
- 16 may award postsecondary credit for skill center courses successfully
- 17 completed by an adult or high school student who has enrolled in such
- 18 course through the community college. The state institution of higher
- 19 education shall not charge a fee for the award of the credits in
- 20 addition to the fees outlined in section 4 of this act.
- 21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** The superintendent of public instruction and
- 22 the state board for community and technical colleges shall jointly
- 23 develop and adopt rules governing sections 1 through 5 of this act, if
- 24 such rules are necessary. The rules shall be written to encourage the
- 25 maximum use of the program and shall not narrow or limit the enrollment
- 26 options under sections 1 through 5 of this act.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. (1) Sections 1 through 6 of this act may be
- 28 implemented in up to five community college districts during the 1993-
- 29 94 school year. Any skill center and school district within any of the
- 30 selected community college districts may participate in the program.
- 31 The five community college districts shall be selected from applicants
- 32 by the state board for community and technical colleges. Sections 1
- 33 through 6 of this act shall be effective throughout the state beginning
- 34 in the 1994-95 school year. Participation by community college

- 1 districts under sections 1 through 6 of this act is in addition to
- 2 agreements between school districts and community college districts in
- 3 effect on the effective date of this section and in the future.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** This chapter is in addition to and not
- 5 intended to adversely affect agreements between school districts and
- 6 community college districts in effect on the effective date of this
- 7 section and in the future.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** Sections 1 through 8 of this act shall
- 9 constitute a new chapter in Title 28C RCW.
