1 AN ACT Relating to emergency medical services; and amending RCW 2 18.73.081.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 18.73.081 and 1990 c 269 s 24 are each amended to read 5 as follows: б In addition to other duties prescribed by law, the secretary shall: 7 (1) Prescribe minimum requirements for: (a) Ambulance, air ambulance, and aid vehicles and equipment; 8 9 (b) Ambulance and aid services; and 10 (c) Minimum emergency communication equipment; 11 (2) Adopt procedures for services that fail to perform in accordance with minimum requirements; 12 13 (3) Prescribe minimum standards for first responder and emergency 14 medical technician training including: 15 (a) Adoption of curriculum ((and period of)) for certification; 16 Procedures for certification, ((recertification,)) (b) decertification, or modification of certificates((+ PROVIDED, That 17 there shall be no practical examination for recertification if the 18 19 applicant received a passing grade on the state written examination and 1 completed a program of ongoing training and evaluation, approved in 2 rule by the county medical program director and the secretary));

3 (c) <u>Requirements for continuing emergency medical technician</u> 4 <u>training as a condition of maintaining certification;</u>

5 (d) Procedures for reciprocity with other states or national 6 certifying agencies;

7 ((<del>(d)</del>)) <u>(e)</u> Review and approval or disapproval of training 8 programs; and

9 ((<del>(e)</del>)) <u>(f)</u> Adoption of standards for numbers and qualifications of 10 instructional personnel required for first responder and emergency 11 medical technician training programs;

(4) Prescribe minimum requirements for liability insurance to be
carried by licensed services except that this requirement shall not
apply to public bodies; and

15 (5) Certify emergency medical program directors.

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
