- 1 AN ACT Relating to vendor rates for service providers who care for
- 2 children; adding a new section to chapter 74.32 RCW; and creating a new
- 3 section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- $\,$  NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that individuals and
- 6 organizations serving children out of the child's home are an important
- 7 part of a continuum of care for children who are removed from abusive
- 8 and dysfunctional homes. The legislature further finds that a
- 9 significant reduction in the number of service providers and high
- 10 provider turnover has occurred in the past ten years. Since 1980, the
- 11 number of group home beds has declined from one thousand seven hundred
- 12 to fewer than four hundred in 1992. Out-of-home care service providers
- 13 currently receive state reimbursement of between twenty and sixty-five
- 14 percent of the cost of caring for dependent children. If reimbursement
- 15 rates to these service providers are not increased to the full cost of
- 16 providing care, further reductions in children's service providers will
- 17 occur, exacerbating an already unacceptable situation. The governor's
- 18 advisory committee on vendor rates is required to analyze vendor rates
- 19 for human services providers and recommend adequate vendor rates to the

- 1 governor and the legislature. The governor's advisory committee has
- 2 not met for several years.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 74.32 RCW 4 to read as follows:
- 5 The governor's committee on vendor rates, established by RCW
- 6 74.32.100, shall analyze vendor rates for nonprofit, licensed, group
- 7 care providers, foster parents, crisis residential centers, private
- 8 adoption agencies and foster care agencies providing case management,
- 9 recruitment, training, and support services and determine the actual
- 10 cost of providing these services. The information shall be published
- 11 annually, sixty days prior to the convening of the regularly scheduled
- 12 legislative session.
