- AN ACT Relating to essential public facilities; and amending RCW 1 36.70A.200.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 36.70A.200 and 1991 sp.s. c 32 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) The comprehensive plan of each county and city that is planning

under this chapter shall include a process for identifying and siting

- essential public facilities. Essential public facilities ((include)) 8
- are those that are critical for the protection of the public health and 9
- 10 safety or those public facilities that are typically difficult to site,
- such as airports, state education facilities and state or regional 11
- transportation facilities, state and local correctional facilities, and 12
- solid waste handling facilities((, and in-patient)). Essential public 13
- 14 facilities may also include facilities owned, operated, or licensed by
- the state that are essential for the operation of state programs, 15
- 16 including substance abuse facilities, mental health facilities, and
- 17 group homes.
- 18 (2) The office of financial management shall maintain a list of

19 those types of essential ((state)) public facilities owned, operated,

- 1 or licensed by the state that are required or likely to be built or
- 2 <u>needed by a state agency for its programs</u> within the next six years.
- 3 The office of financial management may at any time add facilities to
- 4 the list. Public facilities owned, operated, or licensed by the state
- 5 that are not critical to the protection of public health and safety or
- 6 not typically difficult to site shall not be listed by the office of
- 7 <u>financial management as essential public facilities.</u>
- 8 (3) No local comprehensive plan or development regulation may
- 9 preclude the siting of essential public facilities.
