- 2 creating new sections; making an appropriation; and providing an

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** Unless the context clearly requires
 - otherwise, as used in section 2 of this act, "modified student
- 7 attendance calendar" means the restructuring of the school year for the
- 8 purpose of providing more continuous learning and timely opportunities
- 9 for intervention or enrichment by providing a schedule that contains
- 10 shorter vacation periods spread throughout the year, or extending the
- 11 school year beyond one hundred eighty days for some or all students, or
- 12 other variations of the student attendance calendar.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The state board of education may grant
- 14 funds to selected school districts for the purpose of developing and
- 15 implementing a modified student attendance calendar. These grants
- 16 shall be designed to encourage the implementation of a modified student
- 17 attendance calendar, provide an opportunity to evaluate the
- 18 effectiveness of a modified student attendance calendar, and provide

- 1 models for other districts to follow. The grants shall be in such
- 2 amounts as determined by the state board of education. The sum of all
- 3 grants awarded shall not exceed the amount appropriated by the
- 4 legislature for such purposes.
- 5 (2) The state board of education shall adopt rules under chapter
- 6 34.05 RCW establishing a process for school districts to apply for
- 7 grants and establishing criteria for awarding the grants. In awarding
- 8 grants:
- 9 (a) No more than twelve individual schools or district-wide 10 projects shall be selected;
- 11 (b) Projects should reflect a balance among elementary, junior high
- 12 or middle schools, and high schools, and as much as possible, a balance
- 13 among geographical areas and school characteristics and sizes; and
- 14 (c) Special consideration shall be given to a program design that
- 15 includes some or all of the following: Opportunities for timely
- 16 intervention for remediation, enrichment activities, and staff
- 17 development and increased effectiveness in use of district facilities
- 18 and in delivery of the instructional program.
- 19 (3) Each school district selected shall submit an annual report to
- 20 the state board of education on the progress and effectiveness of the
- 21 modified student attendance calendar project as a condition of receipt
- 22 of continued funding.
- 23 (4) The state board of education shall report to the legislature on
- 24 the progress of the modified student attendance calendar grants by
- 25 January 15, 1995, including a recommendation of the number of
- 26 additional pilot projects, if any, which should be funded.
- 27 (5) Projects funded may be extended for a period not to exceed
- 28 three additional school years. Continued funding of a project shall be
- 29 conditioned on successful progress in the implementation of the
- 30 modified student attendance calendar.
- 31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act shall expire June 30, 1997.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The sum of five hundred thousand dollars, or
- 33 as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium
- 34 ending June 30, 1995, from the general fund to the state board of
- 35 education for the purposes of this act.
