- AN ACT Relating to plastics labeling; amending RCW 70.95F.030;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 70.95 RCW; and repealing RCW
- 3 70.95F.020.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 70.95F RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) On or after January 1, 1997, all plastic bottles and rigid
- 8 plastic containers offered for sale shall be labeled with a
- 9 standardized code that indicates the resin used to produce the rigid
- 10 plastic bottle or rigid plastic container. The code shall be based
- 11 upon, but not specifically limited to, the international standard 11469
- 12 "Generic Identification and Marketing of Plastic Products" coding
- 13 system developed by the international organization for standardization
- 14 (ISO).
- 15 (2) On or after January 1, 1997, plastic bottles and rigid plastic
- 16 containers offered for sale shall not be labeled with a resin
- 17 identification code other than that in subsection (1) of this section.

- 1 (3) On or after January 1, 1997, plastic bottles or rigid plastic 2 containers shall not be labeled with a code stating or implying 3 recyclability with a symbol consisting of three triangulated arrows.
- 4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 70.95F.030 and 1991 c 319 s 105 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) A person who, after written notice from the department,
  7 violates ((RCW 70.95F.020)) section 1 of this act is subject to a civil
  8 penalty of fifty dollars for each violation up to a maximum of five
  9 hundred dollars and may be enjoined from continuing violations. Each
  10 distribution constitutes a separate offense.
- 11 (2) Retailers and distributors shall have two years from May 21,  $((\frac{1991}{}))$   $\underline{1997}$ , to clear current inventory, delivered or received and 13 held in their possession as of May 21,  $((\frac{1991}{}))$   $\underline{1997}$ .
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** RCW 70.95F.020 and 1991 c 319 s 104 are each repealed, effective January 1, 1997.
