1 AN ACT Relating to the state-wide salary allocation schedule; and
2 amending RCW 28A.150.410.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.150.410 and 1990 c 33 s 118 are each amended to
5 read as follows:

6 (1) The legislature shall establish for each school year in the
7 appropriations act a state-wide salary allocation schedule, for
8 allocation purposes only, to be used to distribute funds for basic
9 education certificated instructional staff salaries under RCW
10 28A.150.260.

11 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall calculate salary
12 allocations for state funded basic education certificated instructional
13 staff by determining the district average salary for basic education
14 instructional staff using the salary allocation schedule established
15 pursuant to this section. However, no district shall receive an
16 allocation based upon an average basic education certificated
17 instructional staff salary which is less than the average of the
18 district's 1986-87 actual basic education certificated instructional
19 staff salaries, as reported to the superintendent of public instruction

1 prior to June 1, 1987, and the legislature may grant minimum salary
2 increases on that base: PROVIDED, That the superintendent of public
3 instruction may adjust this allocation based upon the education and
4 experience of the district's certificated instructional staff.

5 (3) For purposes of the state-wide salary allocation schedule, the
6 calculations used in determining credits in excess of a baccalaureate
7 degree shall be as follows: (a) For individuals who received their
8 baccalaureate degree before September 1, 1992, college quarter credits
9 and in-service credits computed in accordance with RCW 28A.415.020
10 earned in excess of one hundred eighty, and (b) for individuals who
11 received their baccalaureate degree on or after September 1, 1992,
12 college quarter credits and in-service credits computed in accordance
13 with RCW 28A.415.020 earned after receiving the baccalaureate degree.

14 (4) Beginning January 1, 1992, no more than ninety college quarter-
15 hour credits received by any employee after the baccalaureate degree
16 may be used to determine compensation allocations under the state
17 salary allocation schedule and LEAP documents referenced in the
18 biennial appropriations act, or any replacement schedules and
19 documents, unless:

20 (a) The employee has a masters degree; or

21 (b) The credits were used in generating state salary allocations
22 before January 1, 1992.
