- 1 AN ACT Relating to protection of fish life; adding a new section to
- 2 chapter 75.20 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 77.16 RCW; adding
- 3 new sections to chapter 90.03 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- $\,$  5  $\,$  NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that salmonids and
- 6 other fish are important to citizens of the state, and that numerous
- 7 stocks of salmonids are declining in Washington. Certain regulatory
- 8 protections exist for fish. One such protection is the statutory
- 9 requirement that certain water diversions be screened. Another is
- 10 that bypasses be constructed for fish passage. The legislature finds
- 11 that such protective devices are being intentionally destroyed,
- 12 damaged, or modified in ways that result in loss of fish, and that
- 13 existing penalties are insufficient to prevent such damage. The
- 14 legislature declares that measures must be taken to prevent destruction
- 15 of screens in order to benefit the salmonid resources of the state.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 75.20 RCW
- 17 to read as follows:

It is unlawful to intentionally destroy, damage, or modify fish 1 2 guards, screens, or bypasses resulting in the loss of fish. director shall close a water diversion device if the director finds 3 4 that the holder of the water right associated with the diversion has unlawfully destroyed, damaged, or modified, or caused to be unlawfully 5 destroyed, damaged, or modified, a fish guard, screen, or bypass on the 6 7 diversion. Proceedings under this section shall be in accordance with 8 chapter 34.05 RCW. The water diversion device shall remain closed 9 until the holder of the water right has repaired or replaced the fish 10 guard, screen, or bypass to the satisfaction of the director. subsequent offense committed by the holder of the water right 11 associated with the diversion in question shall relinquish the water 12 right as provided in section 4 of this act. The director shall report 13 all violations of this section to the department of ecology. 14

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 77.16 RCW to read as follows:

17 It is unlawful to intentionally destroy, damage, or modify fish 18 guards, screens, or bypasses resulting in the loss of fish. The director shall close a water diversion device if the director finds 19 that the holder of the water right associated with the diversion has 20 unlawfully destroyed, damaged, or modified, or caused to be unlawfully 21 22 destroyed, damaged, or modified, a fish guard, screen, or bypass on the 23 diversion. Proceedings under this section shall be in accordance with 24 chapter 34.05 RCW. The water diversion device shall remain closed 25 until the holder of the water right has repaired or replaced the fish quard, screen, or bypass to the satisfaction of the director. 26 subsequent offense committed by the holder of the water right 27 associated with the diversion in question shall relinquish such water 28 29 right as provided in section 4 of this act. The director shall report 30 all violations of this section to the department of ecology.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 90.03 RCW to read as follows:
- Any person who violates section 2 or 3 of this act shall relinquish such water right or portion thereof, and the right or portion thereof shall revert to the state. The waters affected by the right shall become available for appropriation in accordance with RCW 90.03.250.

- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 90.03 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 If fish are lost due to violations of section 2 or 3 of this act,
- 4 the violator shall reimburse the state for the value of the fish, as
- 5 determined by the department of fisheries or wildlife. Reimbursement
- 6 moneys shall be deposited into the state general fund.
