- 1 AN ACT Relating to criminal property damage or destruction; and
- 2 amending RCW 9A.48.010 and 9A.48.080.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.48.010 and 1975-'76 2nd ex.s. c 38 s 6 are each 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (1) For the purpose of this chapter, as now or hereinafter amended, 7 unless the context indicates otherwise:
- 8 (a) "Building" has the definition in RCW 9A.04.110(5), and where a 9 building consists of two or more units separately secured or occupied, 10 each unit shall not be treated as a separate building;
- 11 (b) "Damages", in addition to its ordinary meaning, includes any
- 12 charring, scorching, burning, or breaking, or agricultural or
- 13 industrial sabotage, and shall include any diminution in the value of
- 14 any property as a consequence of an act:
- 15 (c) "Malicious" or "maliciously," for purposes of RCW 9A.48.070
- 16 through 9A.48.100, exists either when a person (i) acts with the state
- 17 of mind specified in RCW 9A.04.110(12); or (ii) intentionally damages
- 18 or destroys property without having any reasonable belief that he or
- 19 she is authorized to do so.

- 1 (2) To constitute arson it shall not be necessary that a person 2 other than the actor should have had ownership in the building or 3 structure damaged or set on fire.
- 4 Sec. 2. RCW 9A.48.080 and 1979 c 145 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) A person is guilty of malicious mischief in the second degree 7 if he knowingly and maliciously:
- 8 (a) Causes physical damage to the property of another in an amount 9 exceeding two hundred fifty dollars; or
- (b) Creates a substantial risk of interruption or impairment of service rendered to the public, by physically damaging or tampering with an emergency vehicle or property of the state, a political subdivision thereof, or a public utility or mode of public transportation, power, or communication; or
- 15 (c) Notwithstanding RCW 16.52.070, causes physical damage, destruction, or injury by amputation, mutilation, castration, or other malicious act to another's pet dog or cat or to a horse, mule, cow, heifer, bull, steer, donkey, swine, goat, or sheep which is the property of another. This subsection does not prevent a conviction under RCW 9A.48.070(1)(a) if the physical damages exceed one thousand five hundred dollars.
- 22 (2) Malicious mischief in the second degree is a class C felony.
