- 1 AN ACT Relating to granting temporary licenses to dental hygienists
- 2 licensed in another state; amending RCW 18.29.005; and adding a new
- 3 section to chapter 18.29 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 18.29 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) A person who holds a valid license issued by another state that
- 8 permits the licensee to perform the procedures in subsection (2) of
- 9 this section and is engaged in active practice in that state shall be
- 10 granted a temporary license without the examination required by this
- 11 chapter. The term of the temporary license is eighteen months, and it
- 12 is nonrenewable. The secretary shall require the applicant to: (a)
- 13 File with the secretary documentation certifying that the applicant is
- 14 licensed to practice in another state; (b) file with the secretary
- 15 documentation certifying that the applicant has graduated from an
- 16 accredited dental hygiene school approved by the secretary; (c) provide
- 17 information as the secretary deems necessary pertaining to the
- 18 conditions and criteria of the uniform disciplinary act, chapter 18.130
- 19 RCW, and to demonstrate to the secretary a knowledge of Washington

- 1 state law pertaining to the practice of dental hygiene; (d) pay any 2 required fees; and (e) meet requirements for asepsis and AIDS 3 education.
- 4 (2) A dental hygienist practicing with a temporary license granted 5 under this section may perform hygiene procedures that are limited to:
 - (a) Oral inspection and measuring of periodontal pockets;
 - (b) Patient education in oral hygiene;
- 8 (c) Taking intra-oral and extra-oral radiographs;
- 9 (d) Applying topical preventive or prophylactic agents;
- 10 (e) Polishing and smoothing restorations;
- 11 (f) Oral prophylaxis and removal of deposits and stains from the 12 surface of the teeth;
- 13 (g) Recording health histories;
- 14 (h) Taking and recording blood pressure and vital signs;
- 15 (i) Performing subgingival and supragingival scaling; and
- 16 (j) Root planing.

- 17 (3) A dental hygienist practicing with a temporary license may not 18 perform the following dental hygiene operations and services:
- 19 (a) Giving injections of local anesthetic;
- 20 (b) Placing restorations into a cavity prepared by a licensed 21 dentist and then carving, contouring, and adjusting the contacts and 22 reclusion of the restoration; or
- 23 (c) Soft tissue curettage.
- (4) A person who holds a valid license issued by another state and who demonstrates substantively equivalent education and training in the administration of local anesthetic may be granted an endorsement on a temporary license issued under this section to administer local anesthesia. The endorsement expires with the temporary license.
- (5) A person who holds a valid license issued by another state and who demonstrates substantively equivalent education and training in restorative procedures may be granted an endorsement on a temporary license issued under this section to perform restorative procedures.
- 33 The endorsement expires with the temporary license.
- 34 (6) For the purposes of this section, "active practice" means five 35 hundred sixty hours of practice in the thirty months immediately 36 preceding the date an application for a temporary license under this 37 section is received by the department.

- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.29.005 and 1969 c 47 s 6 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 <u>Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in</u> 4 <u>this section apply throughout this chapter.</u>
- 5 (1) "Department" means the department of health.
- 6 (2) "Secretary" means the secretary of health.
- 7 ((The term)) (3) "Surfaces of the teeth" ((as used in this 8 chapter)) means the portions of the crown and root surface to which 9 there is no periodontal membrane attached.
