- 1 AN ACT Relating to utilization review of health care benefits;
- 2 adding new sections to chapter 48.42 RCW; and providing an effective
- 3 date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 48.42 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 The definitions set forth in this section apply in section 2 of
- 8 this act.
- 9 (1) "Review agent" means a person who performs utilization review
- 10 for a disability insurer, health care service contractor, or health
- 11 maintenance organization.
- 12 (2) "Utilization review" means a system for reviewing the
- 13 appropriate and efficient use or proposed use of health care services
- 14 by insureds, subscribers, enrollees, or other beneficiaries of
- 15 disability insurance policies, health care contracts, or health
- 16 maintenance agreements for the purpose of approving, denying, or
- 17 otherwise making recommendations concerning payment or coverage for
- 18 health care services.

- 1 (3) "Utilization review plan" means a description of the criteria,
- 2 procedures, and standards governing utilization review activities
- 3 performed by a review agent.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 48.42 RCW
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Each review agent shall develop a utilization review plan. The
- 7 disability insurer, health care service contractor, or health
- 8 maintenance organization shall file the plan with the insurance
- 9 commissioner. The plan must include the following:
- 10 (1) Specific standards, criteria, and procedures to be used in
- 11 evaluating hospital, inpatient, or outpatient care that has been
- 12 proposed or is being or has been delivered;
- 13 (2) Those circumstances under which utilization review may be
- 14 delegated to a hospital utilization review program;
- 15 (3) The provisions by which patients or providers may seek
- 16 reconsideration or appeal of adverse decisions by the review agent and
- 17 the time period in which the agent must respond to the request for
- 18 reconsideration or appeal;
- 19 (4) The number, type, and qualifications of the personnel employed
- 20 by or contracting with the disability insurer, health care service
- 21 contractor, or health maintenance organization to perform the
- 22 utilization review;
- 23 (5) The procedures and policies to ensure that a representative of
- 24 the review agent is reasonably accessible at least five days a week
- 25 during normal business hours;
- 26 (6) The procedures and policies to ensure that all applicable state
- 27 and federal laws to protect the confidentiality of individual medical
- 28 records are followed;
- 29 (7) A copy of the written material intended to be sent to the
- 30 insureds, subscribers, enrollees, or beneficiaries and health care
- 31 providers to inform them of the requirements of the utilization review
- 32 plan;
- 33 (8) A copy of any payment incentive provision or plan designed to
- 34 control the amount, duration, or setting in which health care services
- 35 are rendered;
- 36 (9) Evidence of liability insurance carried by the review agent or
- 37 the insurer, contractor, or organization to cover potential liability
- 38 arising from utilization review activities. This liability insurance

- 1 coverage shall be in an amount, type, and nature satisfactory to the
- 2 insurance commissioner; and
- 3 (10) Other information the insurance commissioner determines to be 4 appropriate.
- 5 No insurer, health care service contractor, or health maintenance
- 6 organization may conduct a utilization review until a plan has been
- 7 filed with and approved by the commissioner.
- 8 The insurance commissioner may disallow any utilization review plan
- 9 if it does not meet the standards for utilization review adopted by the
- 10 commissioner by rule.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** This act shall take effect January 1, 1994,
- 12 but the insurance commissioner may take all actions necessary to ensure
- 13 that this act is implemented on that date.
