- 1 AN ACT Relating to historic preservation; adding new sections to
- 2 chapter 27.34 RCW; and creating new sections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that:
- 5 (a) The historical, architectural, archaeological, and cultural 6 heritage of Washington is an important asset of the state and that the
- 7 preservation and maintenance of these resources should be a high
- 8 priority of state government;

- 9 (b) The state owns numerous significant historic properties and 10 there is a benefit to citizens, communities, and the state in the
- 11 preservation of these state-owned resources;
- 12 (c) While historic preservation must be balanced with the needs of
- 13 state agencies, in a time of limited resources preservation of state-
- 14 owned historic properties is a sound long-term investment for the
- 15 state.
- 16 (2) It is, therefore, the purpose of this act to give authority to
- 17 the office of archaeology and historic preservation to identify,
- 18 record, and evaluate all state-owned facilities to determine which of
- 19 these facilities may be considered historically significant, to require

- 1 the office to provide copies of the inventory to departments, agencies,
- 2 and institutions that have jurisdiction over the buildings and sites
- 3 listed, and to authorize the office of archaeology and historic
- 4 preservation to convene a task force of state agencies to develop
- 5 guidelines for state agencies to identify, evaluate, and protect
- 6 historic properties.
- 7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** Unless the context clearly requires
- 8 otherwise, the following definitions apply throughout sections 3 and 4
- 9 of this act.
- 10 (1) "Agency" means the state agency, department, or institution
- 11 that has ownership of historic property.
- 12 (2) "Historic properties" means those buildings, sites, objects,
- 13 structures, and districts that are listed in or eligible for listing in
- 14 the National Register of Historic Places.
- 15 (3) "Office" means the office of archaeology and historic
- 16 preservation within the department of community development.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. By January 2, 1994, the office shall provide
- 18 each agency with a list of the agency's properties currently listed on
- 19 the National Register of Historic Places. By January 2, 1995, agencies
- 20 that own property shall provide to the office a list of those
- 21 properties that are either at least fifty years old or that may be
- 22 eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. If
- 23 funding is available, the office may provide grants to state agencies
- 24 to assist in the development of the agency's list. By June 30, 1995,
- 25 the office shall compile and disseminate an inventory of state-owned
- 26 historic properties.
- 27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The office shall provide technical historic
- 28 preservation training for agency staff involved with the identification
- 29 and management of historic properties.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. (1) The office shall convene a task force to
- 31 develop recommendations on establishing state agency historic
- 32 preservation guidelines to identify, evaluate, and protect historic
- 33 properties. The task force may include but not be limited to
- 34 representatives of affected state agencies and other interested or

- 1 affected parties. Topics the task force shall address include the 2 following:
- 3 (a) Recommendations on long-range management strategies for the 4 protection of state-owned historic properties; and
- 5 (b) Development of a process to review and comment on state agency 6 actions that might affect identified historic properties.
- 7 (2) The task force shall present its recommendations to the 8 governor and the legislature no later than October 31, 1995.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Sections 2 through 4 of this act are each 10 added to chapter 27.34 RCW.
