HOUSE BILL 1998

State of Washington 53rd Legislature 1993 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to higher education; adding new sections to chapter
- 2 28B.10 RCW; creating a new section; repealing RCW 28B.15.515; providing
- 3 an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that there is 6 increasing need for postsecondary educational opportunities for the citizens of the state Washington. The legislature also finds that in the past twelve years postsecondary educational opportunities have been 8 9 severely restricted by state budget policy. The proportion of the 10 state budget dedicated to postsecondary education programs has continued to decrease and, subsequently, the opportunity for this 11 12 state's citizens to participate in such programs has also declined. At 13 the same time, major technological, economic, environmental, 14 demographic changes have exacerbated the need for improved training and 15 education to maintain a high-quality, competitive work force, and a well-educated populace to meet the challenges of the twenty-first 16 17 The legislature finds that this state has not fulfilled its responsibility to provide sufficient opportunity, commensurate with the 18 dramatic growth in this state's population, for its citizens to engage 19

in the postsecondary educational programs that are necessary for their personal and professional improvement and this state's economic vitality.

Therefore, the legislature declares that the policy of the state of Washington shall be to improve the access to, and quality of, this state's postsecondary educational system. The budgetary policy of the state of Washington shall be to provide a level of protection and commitment to the state's postsecondary educational system commensurate with the responsibility of this state to meet the need for educational and professional improvement of its citizens and work force.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** It is the policy of the state of Washington 11 12 that funding for the state institutions of higher education, provided in the omnibus appropriations act, as submitted by the governor, shall 13 14 ensure adequate resources to maintain a state-funded full-time 15 equivalent participation rate at a minimum of the participation rate funded in the last fiscal year of the previous biennium beginning with 16 17 the 1993 fiscal year. The participation rate shall be based on the 18 state's estimated population between the ages of seventeen and forty-19 four.

The funding level per full-time equivalent enrollment established for this minimum number of full-time equivalent students shall, each biennium, be equal to the rate assumed in the omnibus appropriations act for the last fiscal year of the previous biennium plus an inflation factor for, at a minimum, the instruction, primary support, and library support budget categories that is equivalent to the inflation factor used to calculate basic education in the common school system budget request submitted by the governor.

28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** In addition to the minimum participation 29 rate established in section 2 of this act, it is the policy of the state of Washington to achieve the goal of reaching the ninetieth 30 percentile in national participation rates system-wide, except the 31 technical colleges, by the year 2010. This shall be accomplished by 32 33 increasing enrollments through gubernatorial request, in addition to any increases required by section 2 of this act, in regular increments 34 35 each biennium in order to remain on target to achieve this goal by the end of 2009-11 biennium. Pursuant to section 4 of this act, the higher 36 37 education coordinating board shall regularly calculate the additional

1 enrollments necessary each biennium to achieve the purposes of this 2 section.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Formal estimates of the state participation 4 rates necessary to fulfill the requirements of sections 2 and 3 of this 5 act shall be determined by the higher education coordinating board, in conjunction with the office of financial management, based upon state 6 7 population statistics provided by the office of financial management. 8 Estimates of additional or increased full-time equivalent enrollments 9 required by sections 2 and 3 of this act for each succeeding budget period shall be reported by the higher education coordinating board to 10 11 the office of financial management and the legislature by April 1st of 12 each even-numbered year. As a part of this report, the higher education coordinating board shall provide separate estimates of the 13 14 additional enrollments necessary each biennium to remain on target to 15 achieve the enrollment goal established in section 3 of this act.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. It is the policy of the state of Washington 16 17 that the state institutions of higher education have full authority to 18 use innovative approaches to increase the enrollment level of their institutions. The provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this act are used 19 to calculate a minimum state-funded enrollment level, however, each 20 institution has the authority and flexibility to increase the actual 21 22 enrollment from this minimum that it will maintain during any fiscal 23 The level of state-funded enrollment that is adopted under 24 sections 2 and 3 of this act is not an enrollment limit or restriction upon an institution of higher education. The state institutions of 25 higher education are encouraged to deploy or redeploy their existing 26 27 resources to increase access to their institutions if it does not 28 result in a reduction in direct instructional services to students.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. It is the policy of the state of Washington 29 that financial need not be a barrier to participation in the higher 30 education system. Funding for student financial aid in each biennial 31 budget submitted by the governor shall, at a minimum, be equal to the 32 amount provided in the previous biennium adjusted for increases in the 33 34 state-funded full-time equivalent enrollment level pursuant to sections 35 2 and 3 of this act and increases in the cost of attendance as 36 calculated by the higher education coordinating board. The higher

- 1 education coordinating board shall provide these calculations to the
- 2 office of financial management and the legislature by April 1st of each
- 3 even-numbered year.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** RCW 28B.15.515 and 1991 c 353 s 1 are each
- 5 repealed.
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. Sections 2 through 6 of this act are each
- 7 added to chapter 28B.10 RCW.
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 10 state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take
- 11 effect July 1, 1993.
