- AN ACT Relating to higher education; and amending RCW 28B.15.013.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 3 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28B.15.013 and 1989 c 175 s 79 are each amended to 4 read as follows:
- 5 (1) The establishment of a new domicile in the state of Washington 6 by a person formerly domiciled in another state has occurred if such 7 person is physically present in Washington primarily for purposes other 8 than educational and can show satisfactory proof that such person is 9 without a present intention to return to such other state or to acquire 10 a domicile at some other place outside of Washington.
- 11 (2) Unless proven to the contrary it shall be presumed that:
- 12 (a) The domicile of any person shall be determined according to the 13 individual's situation and circumstances rather than by marital status

14 or sex.

- 15 (b) A person does not lose a domicile in the state of Washington by
- 16 reason of residency in any state or country while a member or the
- 17 <u>spouse or dependent of a member</u> of the civil or military service of
- 18 this state or of the United States, nor while engaged in the navigation
- 19 of the waters of this state or of the United States or of the high seas

- if that person returns to the state of Washington within one year of 1 discharge from said service with the intent to be domiciled in the 2 state of Washington; any resident dependent student who remains in this 3 4 state when such student's parents, having theretofore been domiciled in 5 this state for a period of one year immediately prior to the time of commencement of the first day of the semester or quarter for which the 6 7 student has registered at any institution, remove from this state, 8 shall be entitled to continued classification as a resident student so 9 long as such student's attendance (except summer sessions) at an 10 institution in this state is continuous.
 - (3) To aid the institution in deciding whether a student, parent, legally appointed guardian or the person having legal custody of a student is domiciled in the state of Washington primarily for purposes other than educational, the rules and regulations adopted by the higher education coordinating board shall include but not be limited to the following:
- (a) Registration or payment of Washington taxes or fees on a motor vehicle, mobile home, travel trailer, boat, or any other item of personal property owned or used by the person for which state registration or the payment of a state tax or fee is required will be a factor in considering evidence of the establishment of a Washington domicile.
- 23 (b) Permanent full time employment in Washington by a person will 24 be a factor in considering the establishment of a Washington domicile.
- (c) Registration to vote for state officials in Washington will be a factor in considering the establishment of a Washington domicile.
- (4) After a student has registered at an institution such student's 27 classification shall remain unchanged in the absence of satisfactory 28 29 evidence to the contrary. A student wishing to apply for a change in 30 classification shall reduce such evidence to writing and file it with 31 the institution. In any case involving an application for a change from nonresident to resident status, the burden of proof shall rest 32 with the applicant. Any change in classification, either nonresident 33 to resident, or the reverse, shall be based upon written evidence 34 35 maintained in the files of the institution and, if approved, shall take effect the semester or quarter such evidence was filed with the 36 37 institution: PROVIDED, That applications for classification shall be accepted up to the thirtieth calendar day 38
