- 1 AN ACT Relating to school nurses; adding a new section to chapter
- 2 28A.210 RCW; creating new sections; and providing an expiration date.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that schools are being
- 5 asked to play an increasingly expanding role in protecting our
- 6 children's health. Schools are responsible for monitoring the
- 7 immunization of children, evaluating children's hearing and vision, and
- 8 screening for scoliosis. Chronically ill children often require
- 9 medically ordered treatment to enable them to attend school.
- 10 Prescription medication is often required to be given to children
- 11 during the school day. Schools are also responsible for identifying
- 12 and reporting child abuse, identifying drug and alcohol problems,
- 13 treating emergencies, providing counseling and assistance for teenage
- 14 parents, and providing AIDS education. The legislature finds that
- 15 expertise is needed in our schools to protect the health of students in
- 16 our schools and to help students learn.
- 17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.210
- 18 RCW to read as follows:

p. 1 HB 2062

- (1) Beginning with the 1993-94 school year, each school district 1 shall maintain a ratio of not less than one school nurse for every two 2 thousand five hundred full-time equivalent students. In the 1994-95 3 4 school year, each school district shall maintain a ratio of not less than one school nurse for every two thousand full-time equivalent 5 In the 1995-96 school year, each school district shall 6 maintain a ratio of not less than one school nurse for every one 7 8 thousand five hundred full-time equivalent students. In the 1996-97 9 through the 1998-99 school years, each school district shall maintain 10 a ratio of not less than one school nurse for every one thousand fulltime equivalent students. 11
- 12 (2) The state board of education shall adopt rules providing for 13 the initial and continuing certification for persons who have worked as 14 nurses in school settings for the equivalent of three school years 15 within the six years immediately preceding the effective date of this 16 section. Application shall be made within one year after the effective 17 date of this section.
- 18 (3) A second class school district may continue to hire persons who 19 meet the requirements of RCW 28A.210.300.
- 20 (4) As used in this section, "school nurse" means a person holding 21 an educational staff associate certificate as a school nurse or a 22 person who qualifies under subsection (2) or (3) of this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. By December 1, 1998, the superintendent of public instruction shall submit a report to the legislature on the implementation of section 2 of this act and the impact of the services provided. The report shall include recommendations about whether funding for school nurses should be an ongoing responsibility of the state and part of basic education.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall expire 30 June 30, 1999.
