- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29.27.074 and 1967 c 96 s 2 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 The notice provided for in RCW 29.27.072 shall ((set forth the 8 following information:
- 9 (1) A legal identification of the state measure to be voted upon.
- 10 (2) The official ballot title of such state measure.
- 11 (3) A brief statement explaining the constitutional provision or 12 state law as it presently exists.
- 13 (4) A brief statement explaining the effect of the state measure 14 should it be approved.
- 15 (5) The total number of votes cast for and against the measure in
- 16 both the state senate and house of representatives)) identify the state
- 17 measure to be voted upon and provide a brief explanatory statement.

1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 29.79.200 and 1982 c 116 s 15 are each amended to read 2 as follows:

3 Upon the filing of an initiative or referendum petition, the 4 secretary of state shall proceed to verify and canvass the names of the legal voters on the petition. The verification and canvass of 5 signatures on the petition may be observed by persons representing the 6 7 advocates and opponents of the proposed measure so long as they make no 8 record of the names, addresses, or other information on the petitions 9 or related records during the verification process except upon the 10 order of the superior court of Thurston county. The secretary of state may limit the number of observers to not less than two on each side, if 11 in his or her opinion, a greater number would cause undue delay or 12 disruption of the verification process. Any such limitation shall 13 14 apply equally to both sides. The secretary of state may use any 15 statistical sampling techniques for this verification and canvass which have been adopted by rule as provided by chapter 34.05 RCW. 16 petition will be rejected on the basis of any statistical method 17 employed, and no petition will be accepted on the basis of any 18 19 statistical method employed if such method indicates that the petition 20 contains ((less than one hundred ten percent of)) fewer than the requisite number of signatures of legal voters. If the secretary of 21 state finds the same name signed to more than one petition, he or she 22 shall reject all but the first such valid signature. For an initiative 23 24 to the legislature, the secretary of state shall transmit a certified 25 copy of the proposed measure to the legislature at the opening of its 26 session and, as soon as the signatures on the petition have been verified and canvassed, the secretary of state shall send to the 27 28 legislature a certificate of the facts relating to the filing, 29 verification, and canvass of the petition.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect July 1, 1993.
